

A Student guide to **BLACKBOARD**

Blackboard (Bb9) is an online learning system that you can use to view course material for any units that you are taking. You can also complete and submit coursework and monitor your progress using online tests and quizzes. You can communicate and collaborate with your lecturer or other students using discussions or wikis.

Accessing Blackboard

- 1. Log in to **My Manchester**: Click on **my.manchester.ac.uk** (or type the address into a web browser). You will need your University account details. Click on Next and enter your password, then Sign In.
- 2. In **My Manchester**, click on **Tools** then **Blackboard** (see screenshot below). You will see a screen with a list of Courses or Communities to which you have access.
- 3. To enter the course, click on its title in the Course List.
- 4. To enter a Community or Organisation space, click on the name of the organisation in the My Communities list.

The entry page is customised for your course: it may show announcements, course materials or other content.

- 1. The top right corner: Click your name to open a drop -down menu (see insert). From here you can move between your course or organisation spaces. For help, click on the question mark at the bottom of the drop-down menu. To log out, click on the circular icon next to your name and then close the browser.
- 2. These links allow you to move between Blackboard and the My Manchester portal.
- 3. The navigation bar displays the menu trail, or 'breadcrumb trail'. As you browse the course, the 'breadcrumbs' trail displays a clickable path of screens you have followed from the homepage. Click the home icon to return to the course entry page.
- 4. **The course menu** allows quick access to the main materials and activities. There will usually be a choice of menu view options: List view, Folder view, Menu as a separate window, Refresh option. Resting the cursor over the right edge of the menu will reveal a leftward pointing arrow. This allows you to minimise the menu in order to make more room on screen for the main content. Occasionally the Course Menu may disappear if viewing certain files (i.e. PDF files) in the main content area. To regain access to the menu, use the breadcrumb trail or your browser's Back button.
- 5. **The main content window** initially displays your **Course Entry Page**, customised by your course tutor to display current announcements, text links that lead you to the course materials and activities, or other appropriate items. Once you follow a link from the left menu or from the main content window, materials and activities will display here.

Navigation & Learning Modules

Some courses deliver content via Learning Modules, which allow the content to be structured and organised using a Table of Contents in addition to the Course Menu.



Any link you click on in the Table of Contents will take you to the corresponding content page. You can click the **plus sign** to expand and the **minus sign** to collapse the menu. If you need a larger content window, you can minimise the table by clicking on the button, and to maximise again.
