The President's Doctoral Scholarship Awards have been launched with the aim of supporting 100 new PhD scholarships in any discipline.

The scheme aims to attract the very best PhD students and will be supported by £2.5 million of investment over the next four years.

HOW TO REGISTER

It's easy – all you have to do is visit www.perkz.com

- As with most websites you have to create your own login details
- Underneath employee login details click on 'If you are a first time user click here'
- Use the company code when asked this is UNIMAN
- Then just follow the instructions enter your personal email address and your chosen password.

You can use your work email address if you do not have an alternate one - but do not use your work email address in combination with your work password. You must create a new password when creating your login details with Perkz.

CHINESE LESSONS FOR SELFRIDGES STAFF

One of Manchester's most prestigious department stores has turned to University experts to help it communicate better with its Chinese customers.

The Confucius Institute has been working with Selfridges to give staff lessons in Mandarin and Chinese culture.

Katie Popperwell, the Institute's Marketing and Events Officer, found out that staff at the luxury store were experiencing problems communicating effectively with their Chinese shoppers.

A bespoke training package was put together which combined basic Mandarin language skills with elements of Chinese culture.

Jane Sharrocks, General Manager at Selfridges, said: "We are so fortunate to have such experts based here in Manchester.

The training was developed and delivered by Chinese language tutor Lucy Wang and academics from Manchester Business School.



Karen Wang, Deputy Director of the Confucius Institute said: "We hope more businesses will follow suit as China and Chinese consumers offer new business opportunities to the UK."

SCORING HIGH ON LOWERING CARBON CONSUMPTION

The University is one of the top performers in the first national league table to measure the commitment of large organisations to reducing their carbon emissions.

The CRC (Carbon Reduction Commitment) was set up by the Department for Energy and

Climate Change, to improve energy efficiency and cut emissions.

2,104 organisations took part in the CRC, and the University was placed 193rd out of 1,301. This puts us in the top 15% of the league table, and 2nd out of the 20 Russell Group universities.

Lee Barlow, Senior Budget Administrator in the Directorate of Estates and Facilities, said: "When you consider the number of high-profile private sector companies below us in the league table, this is a great achievement."

BEAT THE TRAVEL PRICE RISE

With train ticket prices set to increase at the beginning of January 2012, why not take advantage of the University's interest free loan scheme and buy your annual season ticket now at 2011 prices?

If you use the train, bus or tram to get to work on a regular basis then you could save hundreds of pounds a year.

And if you request your ticket to start before 31 December 2011, you'll be beating the annual price rise which usually takes place on 1 or 2 January.

The interest free loan system also helps staff think about using public transport instead of commuting to work by car, helping to reduce the University's carbon footprint.

Linda Callaghan, Internal Communications Officer, uses the scheme to buy a train season ticket. She said: "It offers a big cost saving – if the interest-free travel loan wasn't available, I'd have to buy monthly season tickets, which would cost me an additional £220 a year. And the ordering process is very fast – my latest ticket arrived less than 48 hours after I handed in the application form to HR."

Andy Lea, from IT Services, used a loan to buy an annual bus pass to travel to work from Fallowfield Not only did he save money – an annual Stagecoach ticket bought through the scheme works out at £80 cheaper than buying it weekly – but he finds it more convenient. "It saves me having to scrabble around for change and with the pass I can hop on and off the bus as often as I like," he said.



As term comes to an end, many staff might be looking forward to a break – but for Ann Lymer-Cox, things are just about to get very busy indeed!

That's because it's Ann's job to manage bookings and organise deliveries for Taste Manchester, the University's delivered hospitality service.

Taste Manchester delivers refreshments, snacks, lunches, buffets, dinners and much more to any location around campus and the city centre. And with the Christmas party season and graduation coming up, Ann knows that December is going to be a hectic month.

She's been in this role for the past two years and still finds that every day is different. Sometimes she'll be responsible for delivering a 7:30am breakfast, others it could be organising a conference dinner for 200 people.

The delivery drivers and their vans have to be co-ordinated, and Ann spends much of her time juggling deliveries and collections, ensuring that journeys are efficient and that fuel is not wasted, keeping in mind the need to lower the University's carbon footprint.

She adds: "We are continually looking at ways to improve, and our drivers have undergone additional training so that they can assist with set ups and collections. Unfortunately there is one thing we cannot change – and that's the Manchester weather! Last year was a particular challenge during the cold spell - ice and snow are not good conditions for pushing trollies!"

Ann says there are lots of new Taste Manchester initiatives in the pipeline which should make booking functions easier for University staff. An online ordering system should be going live soon, and a cashless card for heads of department should make it easier to purchase refreshments from FoodonCampus outlets for those last-minute meetings.

When Ann first came to the role, she only had one member of staff. This has now grown to 11, and recently her team underwent a change and improvement process review under the quidance of Mike Shore-Nye.

Ann says: "We found this a really useful exercise, and all staff were fully involved in making suggestions for improving our service. The campus is spread out over a large area and this means we have to really think about the best ways to deliver what people want."

Ann hopes to expand business internally but her team is also setting its sights on increasing outside clients as well. They have already successfully catered for the Lacrosse World Championships at the Armitage Centre.

She says: "If anyone is looking to arrange Christmas parties, whether it's a small buffet lunch or a festive dinner, we still have availability – just give us a call and we will do our best to arrange something special!"
