## PAYSLIPS GO ONLINE

**Payslips are to go online from Friday 13 April in a much quicker – and greener – service.**

From that date, staff will need to log in to MyView to see their payslip information online.

Moving payslips online will mean:

- you can access your payslip quicker
- your info will be secure
- you will save the University printing 132,000 paper payslips each year
- you'll be able to see an archive of your payslips online

The first online payslips will be received by staff on the weekly payroll on Friday 13 April, by staff on the mid month payroll on Friday 13 April and those on the end of month payroll on Friday 27 April.

## KEEP YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION SECURE

**If you're using MyView for the first time, here are some helpful tips from IT Services on keeping your information secure.**

Do you have a strong password, in keeping with the University's Password Policy?

All University passwords must be at least ten characters long and contain at least two numbers and a special character to be classed as 'strong'.

Having a strong password makes it extremely difficult for anyone to gain access to your account,

helping to protect your own personal data and also that of others (which you may have access to via other University systems, such as Campus Solutions).

If your current password does not meet this requirement you should change it now. To do this, visit the IT Security section of the IT Services website:

A memorable phrase is an extra layer of security, beyond your password. Memorable phrases are common practice in online banking and credit card sites, to keep your sensitive personal details as safe

as possible. As MyView holds your bank account information, pay and National Insurance details, a memorable phrase is required as part of the log in process. You will therefore need to set a memorable phrase in order to access your payslip information via MyView. Memorable phrases will also start to be used in accessing other online University services too, in the future.

## PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

Each month in Staff Update we publish a summary of the President's weekly message, for staff that don't have access to email or the internet at work.



### 26 January

The President had a busy week meeting various stakeholders around the University, including the General Assembly, the Board of Governors Audit and Finance committees and Heads of Schools and Directorates/Units. She also enjoyed spectacular displays at the high voltage labs in the Ferranti Building where Professor Ian Cotton and his team provide one of the best examples of industrial collaboration, particularly with the National Grid.

### 2 February

The President welcomed £38 million funding from the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council for the development of a National Graphene Institute and a Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council (BBSRC) Doctoral Training Partnership grant of £6.3 million to support 63 PhD students. She also visited the Alan Gilbert Learning Commons, describing it as "spectacular", and attended the unveiling of the portrait of alumnus, founding Co-Chancellor of the University and former Chief Executive of Tesco Sir Terry Leahy.

### 9 February

The President was appointed as the independent Co-Chair of the Council for Science and Technology (CST), whose remit is to advise the Prime Minister on strategic science and technology policy issues. In addition she approved proposals to strengthen our gift acceptance policies in light of the Woolf Report with the Policy and Resources Committee and attended her first Board meeting for the Manchester International Festival (MIF).

### 16 February

The President took The Duke of York, Prince Andrew, on a tour of the University in which he met Professors Andre Geim and Kostya Novoselov and their graphene research team and even produced some of the wonderstuff himself. The President also hosted a lively meeting to launch the Universities UK (UUK) report 'The Regional Impact of Universities'. Finally she asked final year students to complete the National Student Survey (NSS), assuring them that we are listening to their opinions and responding to last year's comments.

## THUMBS UP FOR NEW STYLE WELCOME

**The Faculty of Medical and Human Sciences enjoyed positive feedback for its new style Welcome Events for new students.**

Evaluations of the events, one for each School, have recently been completed and rated very well by those students who attended.

The events – which included formal speeches and students reciting an Affirmation which reflected the professional aspects of their course as well as informal networking – provided an excellent opportunity for Heads of School, other key staff and current and past students to welcome the new intake and formally mark the beginning of their studies at our University.

The new students' comments included "inspirational, encouraging, interesting and memorable" and "made me realise how important my role and actions would affect the public as a whole". They also recommended that other Schools should consider similar types of events and even contributed ideas to a range of enhancements for future years.



## UMSS CONSULTATION RESULTS

**The consultation exercise for proposals to change future benefits in UMSS closed on 6 January 2012. The University has considered all the feedback received from members and campus trade unions.**

### Contribution increase

All the original proposals are being introduced with effect from 1 April 2012; however there is one amendment to the increase in contributions. Concerns were raised by some employees and the trade unions about the impact on personal finances of the proposed increase in contributions to 7.5% of earnings. It has therefore been agreed to phase in the increase to contributions in the Final Salary section as follows:

- 1 April 2012 contributions will increase to 7% of earnings
- 1 April 2013 contributions will increase to 7.5% of earnings

### Last chance to join the Final Salary section of UMSS

The Final Salary section will no longer admit new members after 31 March 2012. Existing members will continue with their membership on the modified final salary basis. After 31 March 2012, all new members will earn benefits in the CARE (Career Average Revalued Earnings) section.

If you have previously opted out of membership of UMSS, or did not join when first eligible, you may still apply to become a member. UMSS members are predominantly drawn from staff in grades 1-5. If you wish to join the Final Salary section, your application must reach the Pensions Office in the John Owens building, **no later than Friday 30 March 2012.**

**Project Finance – a new web-based application which will support researchers in the financial management of external research grants and contracts – is available as part of the programme to improve the staff online experience and continuing work of the Review of Research Finance and Administration Implementation (RORFA).**

The service will allow Principal Investigators, Co-Investigators and their project managers to monitor financial transactions within their portfolios of projects. As well providing summaries of expenditure, budgets and commitments to date at overall and task level, the system also allows 'drill down' to individual transaction level. All results can be exported to Microsoft Excel.

## PROTECT YOUR UNIVERSITY IDENTITY FROM 'PHISHERS'

**Beware of 'phishing' scam emails to staff and students.**

Email phishing is an attempt to collect usernames and passwords, or bank account details, from unsuspecting computer users by sending an email pretending to be from a trusted support group. They ask for this information using a carefully prepared message that appears to be genuine.

The email may mention the names of IT support people that you know, and seem to be from a familiar IT support email address. The email messages all ask you to reply, enclosing information such as your username, password, and sometimes other personal information, indicating that lack of response will result in your account being deleted or disabled.

Phishing scams targeted at students are also common at the three main instalment payment dates in September, January and April, whereby students are asked to verify personal and bank details in order to receive their student loan.

These messages are all fake and NEVER originate from any customer services group at the University.

# JUST THE JOB

## JAMES ROBINSON AND GWEN JONES

### Senior Photographers

Centre for Heritage Imaging and Collection Care (CHICC), The John Rylands Library

For photographers James and Gwen, there isn't a typical day's work at The John Rylands Library. One day they could be digitising Latin manuscripts originally housed in the Sistine Chapel, and the next training a photographer from the National Library of Egypt.

The Centre for Heritage Imaging and Collection Care is rapidly gaining a reputation for its painstaking attention to detail, and James and Gwen have already worked on manuscripts and historic documents for institutions such as Tatton Park and the People's History Museum.

Says James: "It's very important to us to capture an image exactly as it would appear in the original form – so we spend a lot of time ensuring that we get a true representation of every colour. We use top of the range digital cameras with a resolution of 80 million pixels."

Gwen is currently working on the 'Rylands Haggadah', a 14th Century service book containing full-page colour illustrations of the story of Exodus. The images will be used to create an eBook Treasure for sale on iTunes which will be launched in the spring. The manuscript itself will be on loan to the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, and will feature in an exhibition for six months.

One of the most striking examples of their work is the complete facsimile of Sharpe's Birds of Paradise, digitised for the Folio Society. James and Gwen have managed to capture the birds' radiant colours, but also the subtlety and precision of the original lithographic plates.

What is unique about the unit is the commitment to attracting commercial work. James adds: "External funding is very important, as this in turn helps to fund projects for our academics, in line with the Library's Digitisation Strategy."

Working in The John Rylands Library provides a rich source of inspiration, as James recently

discovered when working on some glass plate negatives which were donated to the Library in the 1980s. Both James and Gwen have worked with colleagues in Collection Care to clean, re-house and digitise the plates. The collection has revealed some extraordinary insights into everyday life in the Edwardian era.

Gwen says: "We are used to seeing formal portraits from this period, but these are photos that any modern day family would recognise – children in fancy dress, pets, even funeral photos. What is particularly interesting is a self-portrait of a woman who we believe to be the collection photographer – not a traditional female role in those times. We've enlisted the help of other Library staff to help identify locations and houses – so it's got everyone here involved in the creative process!"

James says: "It's great to work with such varied and wide collections – I could be photographing a taxidermy elephant one day for The Manchester Museum, and Renaissance art the next! It's very rewarding – and we are constantly looking at ways to develop new practices working together with our colleagues in Collection Care."
