Summary

The annual report on student cases details the number and nature of cases handled each academic year by Faculties and Professional Support Services, and is required under the Regulations from the relevant areas. The data reported below relate only to formal cases and do not include the significant number of cases which are resolved informally by Schools, PSS Directorates and other central service providers.

The current student profile provides context to the data and is provided at Appendix 1. Whilst the total number of cases submitted is increasing, the number is nonetheless relatively low in comparison to the student population as a whole.


It should be noted that, whilst the number of University of Manchester students taking cases to the Office of the Independent Adjudicator is increasing, this is a national trend which is also seen at other universities of a similar size.

The Review of the Arrangements for University Appeals, Complaints and Student Discipline Cases was reported to Senate on 27th June 2012. The review recommended a number of actions which were addressed for the 2012/13 academic year. These included updates to the Regulations to provide clarity, development of further guidance (ongoing) and the relocation of the function for the review of academic appeals, complaints and misconduct appeals to the Teaching and Learning Support Office. The Teaching and Learning Support Office is working with Faculties, the Office of the General Counsel and UMSU to provide training and support for staff who deal with cases.

Complaints by their nature can involve a variety of factors, and their consideration can often be complex and time-consuming.

Decisions from the first formal stage of consideration are sometimes upheld in part only e.g. the outcome was correct but there are issues raised that should still be addressed such as delays in dealing with cases. A total of £1700 in compensation was offered across three cases. Recommendations that arose from the review stage of complaints involved the need for procedural updates e.g. review of policies, developing best practice, and in how to address communication issues. The student whose complaint was found on review to be justified was permitted an opportunity for their PhD studentship application to be reconsidered by their School.


The total number of Complaints taken to review decreased from 15 in 2010/11 to 13 in 2011/12.



The total number of Academic Appeals taken to review increased from 45 in 2010/11 to 49 in 2011/12. The main area for review requests concerned the submission of mitigating circumstances.

At the review stage three appellants were offered a total of £700 across all three cases (£200/£250/£250) in compensation for delays; two in respect of delays associated with the consideration of the appeal at Faculty and the third due to delays with a School's moderation process. Recommendations that emerged across the cases included updates to documents and improvements in communication with students.

After the review stage, the University of Manchester procedures are completed and students are issued with a Completion of Procedures letter, as required by the Office of the Independent Adjudicator.

In 2010/11, eight Faculty and ten SDC decisions were appealed, a total of 18 compared to the total of 31 for 2011/12. In the one Faculty decision that was changed this was a complete rescission of the original decision. In the SDC decisions that were changed the finding of guilt for the offences remained upheld but a lower penalty was administered as those penalties originally imposed were considered to be disproportionate e.g. one appellant presented new mitigation for consideration not available to the SDC that provided a reason as to why the offence was committed.

It is important to note that in the Conduct and Discipline category the overwhelming majority of students having been subject to these procedures in 2011/12 were international students. The second highest indicator of impact is on postgraduate students at Faculty level who accrue to 68% of the total number in that category but only amount to 21% of the student population overall.

After the review stage, the University of Manchester procedures are completed and students are issued with a Completion of Procedures letter, as required by the Office of the Independent Adjudicator.

Fitness to Practise⁸

Fitness to Practise cases are reported separately from other conduct and discipline cases because they often emerge from ill health circumstances, although they can include conduct and discipline matters. Cases can involve one or a combination of types of misconduct such as criminal convictions, dishonesty, ill health, misconduct and unprofessional behaviour.

Fitness to Practise cases usually originate in the Faculty of Medical and Human Sciences because of the nature of the programmes of study undertaken in that Faculty.



The OIA is appointed as the national, independent body to consider student complaints. The OIA has no regulatory powers over universities and cannot punish or fine them, however universities are expected to act upon their recommendations. The Teaching and Learning Support Office has become the main contact for the OIA within the University and has developed a protocol in the handling of complaints submitted.

Academic Appeals formed the majority of cases that students progressed as complaints to the OIA. No case taken to the OIA during 2011/12 was found to be justified. Of the two considered to be not eligible for consideration, one was assessed as having not exhausted the University's internal procedures and the other was pursuing legal action. The OIA still however made recommendations in specific areas, namely in student attendance monitoring and the circulation of materials to students in advance of conduct and discipline hearings.


One complainant after completing internal procedures at the University initiated a judicial review questioning the independence and impartiality of the OIA in the handling of their complaint. The judgement found in favour of the OIA. The OIA subsequently accepted the complainant's submission after the judgement was issued and found it to be not justified.


