### PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units, you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any core courses)
- 60 credits in each semester (NB. you may, if you are choosing 10 credit Free Choice/Minor courses, take a maximum of 70 and minimum of 50 credits in either semester).
- At least 100 credits, and up to 120 credits of Level 3 courses; a maximum 20 credits at Level 2.

Particular programme guidelines:

- As a joint honours student, you **must** ensure that you take a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 80 credits in each subject. If you choose to take 40 credits in one subject of your Joint Honours programme, you must take a minimum of 60 credits in the other subject.
- Should you wish to do a PGCE secondary course in English and Drama after your degree, you are advised to take an equal number of credits in both subjects, not doing so may affect your ability to study certain PGCE programmes.
- The Extended Dissertation in Drama should be considered as 20 credits in each semester.
- The Dissertation in Drama may be completed in either semester. Please note there is a different course code for each semester.
- You are expected to select at least 20 credits of theatre-focussed units across your dissertation, study units and practical units, as relevant.
- It is possible to take ONE 20 credit unit from Level 2. You should note however the overall requirement that no more than 20 credits may be taken at level 2, so that it is not permitted, in particular, to take this option in addition to taking a 20-credit free-choice or language option at level 2.
- Please think carefully about your unit selection and workload balance.
- **Things for you to consider when making your unit selection:**
  - Carefully weigh up the demands of 40 credit practical units. These units can take up several days a week so they demand a significant commitment from you in terms of time spent in university. The timetabling and weighting also significantly restricts your other unit choices.
  - Selecting both an Extended Dissertation and a Practical Option takes up over half your credits. Think carefully about where you have found successes and challenges in levels 1 and 2.

- All 40 credit practical units require a balance of skills including a very good ability to organise and motivate yourself, ability to collaborate well with others and to manage your time and that of other people.

#### HELPFUL HINTS:

- The semester a unit is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code. E.G CLAH30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1 and '2' indicates Semester 2
- To enrol on any of the units use the Self Service area of your My Manchester page
- Please check the timetable for units that you choose to ensure that there are not any clashes.
