What is 'askme'?

'askme' is a visual campaign that enables students to identify knowledge holders and key information points should they have any queries during their first couple of weeks at university. It is important that we make a fantastic first impression and support all students to the best of our ability, in what can be an overwhelming experience for many.

What will I need to do?

By wearing the 'askme' badge you are identifying yourself as a person that can be of assistance or take ownership of any enquiries that a student might come to you with. You are not expected to know everything about the University but with the help from this guide and other contacts you may have, you should be able to provide a satisfactory answer or solution.

What will I be asked?

You could literally be asked anything from 'where's the nearest toilet?' to 'how can I meet new people?' and anything else in between. This guide does its best to cover all the general topics that we know students tend to ask whilst they are finding their feet. Also, they should have received a printed copy of the Crucial Guide: Welcome to Manchester which tells them all they need to know about settling into life at Manchester. However if you get asked a question that you genuinely cannot answer please direct them to the 'askme' desk in University Place.

Top tips for badge wearers

- Wear your 'askme' badge at all times and remember if you put on a jacket or a coat then transfer your badge to your outer layer of clothing
- Have a read of your 'askme' guide and carry it with you wherever you go so you are prepared to answer any questions
- Pick up a campus map from the Visitors Centre so you can give directions confidently – many of the Welcome publications make reference to the campus map building numbers
- If you genuinely don't know the answer to a student's enquiry then direct them to the 'askme' desk in University Place
- Be friendly and smile you may get asked the same questions over and over again but remember, it is the first time the student has heard the answer

How do I register?

Before a student can 'Register' they must have completed the following steps:

- 1. Complete IT sign up every student should have received an email, to their personal email account, with instructions about how to do this.
- 2. Confirm they are attending using their new username and password they should log on to www.mymanchester.ac.uk and click the link to confirm that they are attending.
- 3. (For International students only) Complete International Student Check-In see page 5 for more information.

The student is now in a position to 'Register'! This can be done online at www.mymanchester.ac.uk between 2-30 September (please make students aware that late payment charges are applied after this date).

More about International Student Check-In

If a student is not from the European Economic Area (EEA) then they must attend International Student Check-In before they can pick up their student card.

At check-in, students will be asked for their passport and visa information and they will be able to obtain bank letters to assist with opening a UK bank account as well as arrange a police registration appointment (if needed).

After 30 September students can collect their Student Cards from the Student Services Centre, Burlington Street 57 and Student Services Desk, Joule Library 1.





Most places on the main campus can be reached on foot and you might want to recommend to students that they can pick up a Campus Map which will help them find their way around.

How do I travel between the Main Campus and North Campus?

Students can use bus route 147 for free travel between the Students' Union ${\color{red} 68}$ and the Sackville Street Building ${\color{red} 1}$. The bus runs approximately every 10 minutes between 7:15 – 18:15 on weekdays and stops at all bus stops in between. Students need to show their student card to get free travel between these points however from ${\color{red} 12-22}$ September they can show a copy of the Crucial Guide publication instead.

How do I get to Victoria Park or Fallowfield from the Main Campus?

If students have access to a bike they can cycle to and from Fallowfield or Victoria Park from the Main Campus. There are designated places to secure bikes on all of the campuses. Alternatively buses run regularly from the Oxford Road to Fallowfield area, dropping at Whitworth Park, Victoria Park, Rusholme and Fallowfield.

Tip: Look out for the blue Magic Buses (42, 43, 142, 143) as these tend to be the cheapest for one off journeys.

How do I get into the city centre?

For a free ride into the city centre, students can jump on the bus route 147 and get off near Oxford Road train station. They can then hop on the Metroshuttle 2 (small green bus) from the bus stop directly outside Revolution or Oxford Road train station. The Metroshuttle buses are great for getting around the City Centre and are completely free to everyone. Advise them to check out the Transport for Greater Manchester website for more details (www.tfgm.com).

There are many other buses that run from the Main Campus to the city centre. Any bus with Piccadilly on the front would do the trick and the costs may vary depending on the bus company.

Where can I go shopping?

There are three main shopping areas in Manchester for students who are looking to buy clothes or furniture:

- 1. The city centre is closest and has a variety of shops and markets for all budgets and tastes
- Intu Trafford Centre is an indoor shopping centre on the edge of Manchester and buses run there regularly from Piccadilly Gardens
- 3. The Lowry Outlet Mall at Salford Quays sells high street and designer labels at discounted prices, jump on the Metrolink towards Eccles or Media City.

For groceries and household goods you could recommend the following supermarkets: For value for money: Aldi, 67-71 Market Street, Manchester City Centre For convenience: Morrisons Local, Grafton Street, Manchester For Fallowfield: Sainsbury's or Tesco Express both situated on Wilmslow Road For size and variety: ASDA Eastlands Supercentre, Ashton New Road, Manchester For Worldwide foods: Meezan Superstore, 132-142 Wilmslow Road, Rusholme

Where can I get something to eat?

Students will be spoilt for choice with lots of cafes, restaurants and shops offering tasty cuisines from around the world. A good place to direct them to would be Eats Restaurant in University Place 37 as it has a large variety of hot and cold food at a reasonable price or the Small World Café at the International Society in William Kay House 69 for freshly prepared dishes and large portions.

Where is the nearest cinema?

The closest mainstream cinemas to the Main Campus are the Odeon at the Printworks and AMC at the Great Northern on Deansgate. If the student is living in Fallowfield then they might find the Cineworld, at Parrs Wood Entertainment Complex in Didsbury, more convenient. Alternatively, The Cornerhouse is an art house cinema on Oxford Road that shows avante garde movies, foreign language films and documentaries.

Is there a bank nearby?

There are branches of nearly every major bank within a short walking distance of the Main Campus. RBS is located in the Precinct Centre 30, while HSBC, Lloyds and Barclays are located just south of the Students' Union 68 and a Natwest opposite. Tip: Avoid the lunchtime rush.

How can I get wifi?

The University has two main wireless networks that students can connect to. The captive portal includes 'University of Manchester' or 'UOM_WIFI' which are available in most buildings and students only need their university username and password to connect. This type of connection is ideal for occasional users and visitors.

If the student is going to be a regular user then they may want to consider setting up 'eduroam' on their device. Once the device is configured it will automatically pick up a wireless connection on campus, whenever there is one available, and students won't need to keep entering their login details. Where is a cheap place to buy books?

#TextbookRescue is a new initiative by the library to re-home old textbooks donated to them by recent graduates. A selection of free textbooks will be available to students in all libraries on Wednesday 18 September.

Students may also buy second hand textbooks from Blackwells bookshop at the University Precinct Centre 30 or Oxfam just past the Academy 78. You could also advise them to check the notice boards around campus as other students often display notices about textbooks for sale.

Where can I get an academic diary?

Students can buy University branded academic diaries from the Giftshop in University Place 37 or The Store in the Students' Union 68.

Alternatively Blackwells bookshop and Rymans stationers, located at the University Precinct Centre 30, also stock a variety of academic diaries.

What should I do if I need a doctor?

Students are advised to sign up with a local GP practice at the Start of Year Fair or go to www.nhs.co.uk and use the service finder to locate their nearest GP.

Meanwhile for anything urgent but non-life threatening, suggest the NHS walk-in clinic within the Manchester Royal Infirmary (opposite Whitworth Art Gallery, 84). See Crucial Guide Live for more guidance on the range of NHS services available.



Students can search for part-time 'Jobs on Campus' via the CareersLink online service www.manchester.ac.uk/careers/vacancies, although they will need to have their University username and password to gain access to the site. If the student wants more specific guidance or support direct them to the Careers Service in Crawford House, Booth Street East 33.

What do I do if I need to contact security?

Students can contact Campus Security 24 hours a day on 0161 306 9966.
