3: Choosing a Minor

As a single honours student on this programme you have the option to study a minor in either Egyptology or Digital Humanities. Taking a minor allows you to explore the subject area, whilst still allowing you to complete your single honours degree. At the end of the first year, you can choose to continue with the minor in years two and three, and have the subject feature in your degree title if you wish. Alternatively, if you decide to drop the minor, you can still make use of free choice credits in years two and three.
