

International Student Police Registration Office

It is a legal requirement stated by the Home Office under The Immigration Regulation Act 1971, that as a condition to remain in the UK certain Foreign Nationals are required to register with the Police in whose area they are to reside. Foreign Nationals MUST register within 7 days of arrival in to the UK.

This only applies to Foreign Nationals who have been granted leave to remain for more than 6 months or where an extension is granted therefore making the total leave to remain more than 6 months. Check your passport or visa to see if the requirement to register with the Police within 7 days is printed there.

YOUR APPOINTMENT

An appointment must be made to register. To arrange your appointment please email: gmp.ivro@gmp.police.uk with the following information:

- » Your name (as stated in your passport)
- » Your Nationality (as shown on your passport)
- » Your Date of Birth
- » Your reason for making this appointment
- » Name of the University you attend
- » The length of your visa
- » When you arrived in the UK
- » If you have a Police Registration certificate from a previous registration in the UK you must also provide the certificate number.
- » The Police will then issue a date and time to attend via email. Before you attend the appointment you will need to collect a confirmation of address and attendance letter from the University.

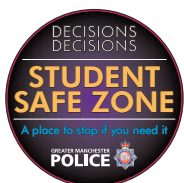

KEEPING SAFE: REDUCE THE RISKS WHILST TRAVELLING BY FOLLOWING THE TIPS BELOW.

TRAVELLING ON FOOT

- » Be alert - Plan your route and avoid short cuts through unlit or deserted areas and where possible, walk with a friend after dark.
- » If you are going somewhere unfamiliar after dark, you may want to let a friend know where you are going and what time you expect to be back.
- » Be aware of your surroundings – listening to music with headphones may prevent you from hearing traffic.
- » Cover up your smartphone, MP3 and jewellery.
- » If you are using a handbag, keep it close to you and do not leave it unattended.
- » Ensure that your keys are close to hand when returning to your home or car.
- » Do not resist if your bag is snatched but do shout for help.
- » If you think you are being followed, go to the nearest place where there are people, such as a pub, shop, or well-lit house and call the police.



Look out for buildings displaying the Safe Zone sticker as they will provide a safe place to stop.

To find out where the safe zones are located in Manchester, Salford and Bolton download the gmp app. (see below)

- » If a car stops next to you, keep your distance.
- » Do not hitchhike or accept lifts from strangers.
- » Carry only the money you need for your journey, where possible use your debit card instead.
- » If you wish to use a personal alarm, keep it in your hand so that if you are confronted you can use it, then run and shout to attract attention.

TRAVELLING BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

- » Wait where it is well lit and there are other people.
- » On a station, stand well back on the platform.
- » On a bus, the safest place to sit is near the driver or conductor.

- » If you feel uneasy or threatened, move to another seat or carriage. If necessary, tell the driver, conductor or guard.

TRAVELLING BY TAXI

- » Use a licensed taxi or private hire vehicle from a recognised firm or official taxi rank.
- » Look for the official licence plate number, and ask to see the driver's badge if it isn't visible.
- » Make sure you have the telephone number of the taxi company you use.
- » If possible, share a taxi with a friend.
- » Always sit in the back. If you chat to the driver, do not give away any personal details. If the driver makes you feel uneasy, ask him to stop at a busy public place and get out.
If he refuses to stop, raise the alarm by waving or shouting out of the window and phone 999.

MOBILE PHONE SECURITY

- » Where possible, avoid displaying or using your smartphone in public.
- » Keep the phone with you and do not leave it unattended.
- » Always use the phone's security lock code or pin. Record the phone's IMEI number. To get this number dial *#06# on your mobile phone and register on www.immobilise.com
- » Activate or load tracking on your mobile phone it can help retrieve it should it be lost or stolen.
