Early Years - Art School

Creative, practical, artist-led workshops designed to support a child's early experiences of an art gallery. For EYFS, nurseries, children's centres and community groups working with children under 5.

Choose from:

- Draw
- Make
- Express

Draw

Children often make marks and scribbles to communicate their earliest thoughts before words, language and writing have fully developed.

Focusing on early child communication and development *Draw* combines drawing and meaning-making with children exploring the gallery and park through creative scribbles and playful drawing activities.

Make

Work with an artist and get hands on, creative (and messy) in our Clore Learning Studio. Focusing on personal, social and emotional skills, children will be encouraged to play and work together to create extraordinary masterpieces inspired by what they see.

Express

Much of young children's learning is physical. *Express* is a fun and lively session embracing and developing children's physical skills. Led by dancers and musicians it combines music, movement and art to encourage creativity, imagination and self expression.

We know it's the little things that make a big difference when on a trip out with young children. Our workshops are designed with this in mind so we build in time for drink, snack and toilet breaks and can work closely with you to make sure we cater for all your group's needs.

It is a laboratory for trying out ideas and playing with materials, a space where children can get messy, play creatively and follow their own interests

Draw

Many artists in our collection express what they see, think and feel through drawing. This playful, hands-on workshop encourages your pupils to do likewise. Pupils will explore a range of drawing techniques in a variety of media and will leave with an understanding of how sketchbooks support artistic practice.

Make

Learn how artists, architects and makers build, shape and create. Working alongside a professional artist-maker, pupils will learn new practical art skills and ways to communicate their ideas in both 2 and 3 dimensions. Choose from printmaking, textiles and 3D.

Express

The gallery is an extraordinary visual stimulus that can help generate ideas, inspire creativity and encourage expression. Working with our team of performers, children will learn to express themselves within their chosen art-form. The workshop aims to encourage all pupils to participate and work together in teams to showcase their work in a final mini performance in the gallery. Choose from dance, music, drama, spoken word or animation.

Using promenade theatre techniques children will develop an imaginative story that explores our attitudes towards the environment. Pupils will learn practical design skills including prop making for their final performance.

Our new gallery is fully accessible, with level access from Denmark Road to the park entrance and a gentle slope to the entrance on Oxford Road. There are three off street parking spaces for Blue Badge holders that can be accessed off Denmark Road. Guide dogs are welcome. Light levels can be low in some galleries; please speak to a member of staff if you would like any help, or to ask about our large-print guides and spoken tours.

The gallery has accessible toilets with baby changing, lifts, seating inside and outside the gallery and free portable stools.
