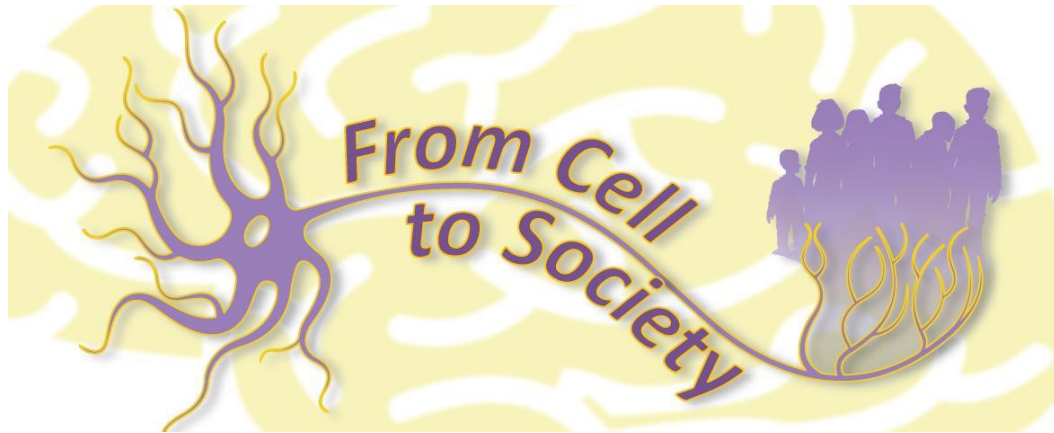

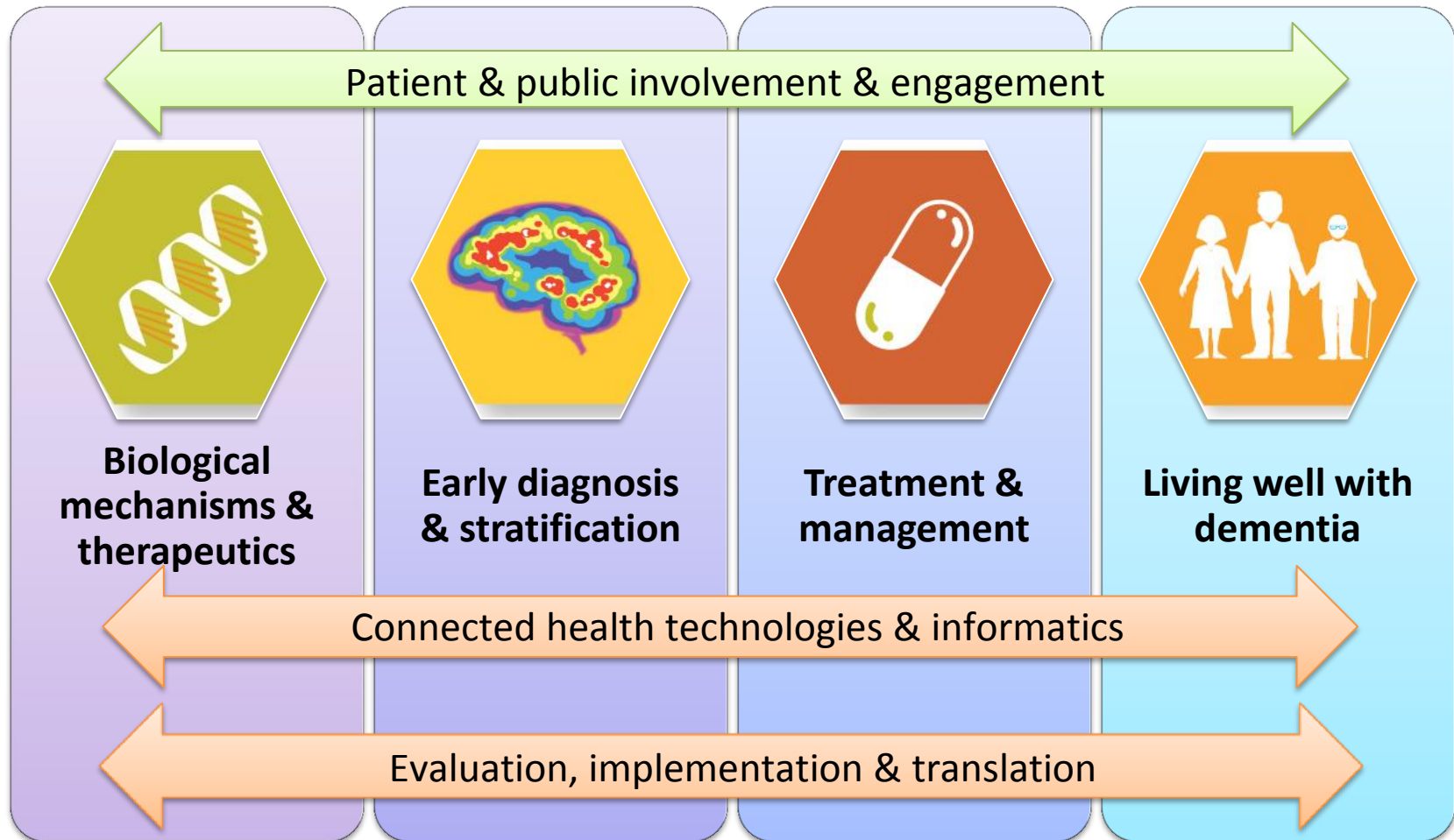
Dementia@Manchester aims to:

Dementia and Devolution: how can research inform the plans

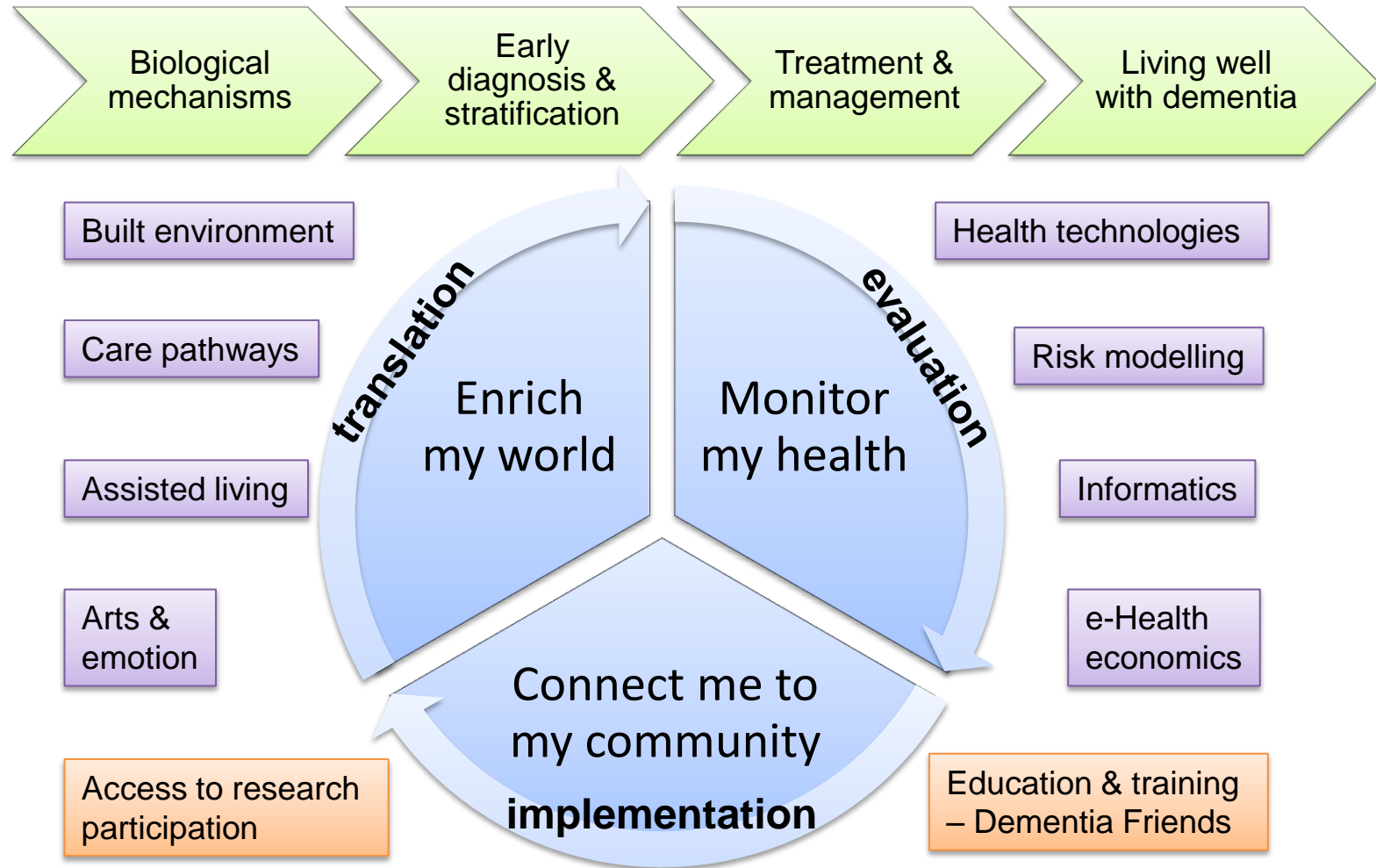
- To improve the lived experience for people with dementia and their carers
