At our Maths and Sciences Teachers Conference, all educators in secondary Biology, Chemistry, Maths, and Physics are invited to find out about research taking place at The University of Manchester that is relevant to your own professional development. If you want to know what research is happening NOW in your field, or want an up to date example to illustrate to your students the purpose and application of your subject – then this conference will be of interest to you.

Through attending a keynote lecture, a choice of workshops, a networking fair and a panel discussion, you will gain insight into the latest research that is pushing the bounds of knowledge, across both theoretical and applied disciplines. The conference provides an update on diverse research areas which are underpinned by the knowledge and skills first taught at school in Maths and Science subjects. At this level research often breaks down disciplinary and practical boundaries, and you will gain insight into the fruits of interdisciplinary working. Our aim is to update and inspire secondary science educators, whilst providing exciting content for you to translate into classroom teaching.

The conference spans two days, and you can attend one or both of these days, in accordance with your interests and responsibilities. The first event will focus on Biology and Chemistry, the second on Maths and Physics. The conference will also provide the opportunity to network and share best practice with other teaching professionals and University academics. These events are entirely free of charge and refreshments are provided.
