Is your Blackboard course ready for Semester 2?

Blackboard courses become visible to students on Monday 25 January 2016 (unless you selected a different option when you activated your Bb course). Please make sure your courses are activated and populated with content.

You can access Blackboard via [My Manchester](#) for staff. Click on the link to Blackboard in the Teaching category of links (you may need to click on 'View all'). You will be able to see and update your Bb course in the Course List on the Blackboard home page within 24-48 hours of it being activated.

Have an eLearning query?



Requests for support for eLearning activities—from staff or students—should be directed via the University's online support centre, <https://supportcentre.manchester.ac.uk/>. You will be asked to log in, using your University username and password. You will then have the option to *make a request* (select 'General eLearning Enquiry') or *report a fault*. The support centre Knowledge Base is gradually being imported from its previous location at <http://servicedesk.manchester.ac.uk/portal/ss>, which is—for now—the most up-to-date resource.

You can still use elarning@manchester.ac.uk. However, if you are emailing from a personal email account, rather than a University account, you will receive a message asking you to submit your query via the online support centre. External staff, without a University IT account, can go to <http://www.itservices.manchester.ac.uk/help>, and click on the link that says, "I am unable to log in or don't have a University IT Account".

JANET network issues and assignment deadlines

As you will be aware, since 1 December there has been unscheduled service disruption to external networks provided to UoM by Janet (Joint Academic Network). The network appeared to be more stable on 9 December. However, this has affected internet connections and access to websites, including Blackboard. As Blackboard is hosted externally, some students may be able to access Blackboard at home via non-Janet internet connections. However, students who rely on accessing the internet on-campus will have been affected (including halls of residence).

If you are planning or have scheduled deadlines, marking or feedback via Blackboard you may need to amend dates to accommodate this disruption.

Ensuring the stability of Blackboard

In order to ensure the stability of Blackboard it is sometimes necessary to undertake essential maintenance of the system.

From 27 September regular maintenance of Blackboard has been scheduled from 2am-5am GMT on Sunday mornings. This will include approximately 30 minutes downtime. Please be aware of this when planning work.
