Turnitin unavailable 16 November 2015

What is happening?

An upgrade to the Turnitin Building Block is necessary to update the Turnitin Services domain name. The upgrade does not introduce significant changes in functionality or interface changes.

Who is affected?

Staff and students using Turnitin and/or Grademark for submission, marking or returning feedback and grades.

What does this mean for you?

Turnitin will be unavailable on **Monday 16 November** between **8.00am and 10.00am GMT** for all staff

and students: no submissions, viewing, marking or assignment creation will be possible during this time. All other aspects of Blackboard or MyManchester will be available as normal during this period.

What do you need to do?

A message has been posted on StudentNet to warn students of this maintenance window.

If you are planning or have scheduled submission deadlines, marking or feedback collection on or around 16th November you may need to amend dates to accommodate this short downtime.

Safe Harbor

You may be aware that, following a recent judgement by the ECJ, contracts which rely on Safe Harbour are no longer valid. No further contracts that involve the transfer of personal data to the US should be entered into without first contacting the Records Management Office (dataprotection@manchester.ac.uk).

Jisc produced a Note for Institutions about the Safe Harbour ruling (13 Oct 2015), and have followed that up with a blog post (21 Oct 2015), Beyond Safe Harbour—what happens now?, which provides some clarity about what institutions need to be reviewing.
