Course unit enrolment will open for first year students on Monday 28th September 2020. You will find that you have already been enrolled on compulsory the **Politics, Philosophy** courses listed above, as well as 20 credits of compulsory **Mathematics and Statistics** and 20 credits of **Economics**. However, you will be in Tutorial or Class 00. This is a holding tutorial, and, if it is a first semester unit, you will need to move yourself out of it into a live tutorial as soon as possible. *Please note: When selecting second semester units, **only TU00 will be available**. You will be able to select tutorials closer to the start of Semester 2.*

In **Economics**, students will be enrolled on the Microeconomics 1 and Macroeconomics 1 sequence. However, if you wish to take the more mathematics-focused Microeconomic Analysis and Macroeconomic Analysis sequence, you will need to speak with a member of staff in Economics.

Your **Mathematics and Statistics** have been allocated taking into consideration your prior attainment before coming to University. If you have not taken standard A Level qualifications, and you think that the level you have been allocated to is not correct, please contact the Economics link person and it will be looked at again.

All of the above courses are mandatory and students must pass these courses with a minimum mark of 40% in order to progress into the Second Year of the PPE Degree.

As well as taking the above courses, you will need to select 20 credits of Politics and 20 credits of Philosophy from the choices below. Because of the way courses have to be balanced over the year, you will have to take one course in Semester 1 and the other in Semester 2. To determine which semester a course runs, you need to check the last digit of the course code. "1" is First Semester; "2" is Second Semester; "0" is all year.

You must balance your Politics and Philosophy options so that you have no more than 70 credits and no less than 50 credits in each semester of the course.

Students must pass at least 20 credits of Philosophy units with a minimum of 40% in order to progress into the Second Year of the PPE Degree.

LANGUAGE COURSES

If you want to take a Language Course, you need to apply to the LEAP Office. Your level will be assessed and, if you are accepted onto a Language Course, you need to take no further action. The LEAP Administrator will enrol you onto the course. **Language courses are available to PPE students in the second and third years of the programme.**
