HOW TO RECYCLE IN YOUR HALL

In your halls kitchen, you will find a <u>brown</u> recycling bag and a <u>blue</u> recycling bag. Have a look at the image below for which items go in which bag. When these are full, take them outside to your nearest <u>brown</u> and <u>blue</u> recycling bins to empty them.

The remaining **non**-recyclable general waste then goes in the black general waste bins.

It is your responsibility as students to stay on top of your recycling and general waste – don't let it build up! Make a rota, get into the habit of taking out your recycling and non-recyclable waste on a regular basis.

Last year, each student on average recycled nearly 25kg of waste per person!

Veg Box People is:

Convenient: Pick up your veg every Tuesday afternoon on the University of Manchester main campus (outside George Kenyon Hall of Residence 12-5pm) or after these hours in 'The Shop' in University Place.


Fresh: Most of our veg is grown within 50 miles of Manchester. It's picked to order, often just hours before it appears in your box, so it's super fresh

Affordable: Our veg boxes come in three sizes: a small box for £8, medium for £11 or large for £14

Fallowfield Discounted Bike Sales

Free overt bike marking

The University offers a free overt bike marking service for all students.

A unique serial number is 'etched' onto the frame in a highly visible location. The owner/cycle details are recorded and entered onto a University database to enable our security officers to check bikes.

The relevant information is also entered onto the national property database, Immobilise. The Police check this database when they come into possession of stolen/recovered property.

You can also register other personal property that has a serial number, like mobile phone, laptop etc.
