

DBS Flow Diagram - all programmes except Counselling

You may not be required to complete a DBS check if you have already completed one at The University of Manchester. If this is the case, please contact your Programme Administrator for further advice before proceeding through this flow diagram

Will your placement/research involve:

1. Working with children - classified as an individual under the age of 18; or
2. Performing a "Regulated Activity" with vulnerable adults - classified as an individual aged 18 or over that is receiving one of the following services:
 - a. Health care
 - b. Relevant personal care
 - c. Social care work
 - d. Assistance in relation to general household matters by reason of age, illness or disability
 - e. Relevant assistance in the conduct of their own affairs
 - f. Conveying (due to age, illness or disability in prescribed circumstances)
