Incredible Edible Manchester

The Students' Union arm of Incredible Edible Manchester (which is student-led) is organising another event this coming **Saturday 3 December** at the **Moseley Road plot in Fallowfield** (opposite Fallowfield Campus /the Armitage Centre) from **12pm**.

Incredible Edible is large environmental movement that has nearly 50 groups across the UK and hundreds worldwide with the movement stretching from Canada to New Zealand.



In the autumn of 2014, The University of Manchester launched Incredible Edible Manchester in partnership with Manchester City Council. The initiative aims to give local communities the opportunity to grow their own sustainable fruit and vegetables, whilst improving biodiversity in the area at the same time. We've transformed plots across South Manchester into 'incredible edible' sites where fruit, vegetables and herbs have been planted. The aim is that once the plots were fully transformed into 'incredible edible' sites, all people living in the local community have free access to use the edible plants to eat and cook with.

The aim of Incredible Edible Manchester is that it:

- Enables fruit and vegetables to grow for all the local community to use (in a time when many people are experiencing food poverty).
- Encourages the community to use organic fresh produce in their diets, encouraging more healthy living.
- Brings everyone together to help create a more sustainable community for everyone.





• Offers volunteering opportunities for students looking to learn more about sustainable urban food production, offering an accessible hands-on approach.

One of the plots is on Moseley Road (opposite the Armitage Centre) in Fallowfield. About a year ago this plot was passed onto a fantastic group of students who manage the student-led part of Incredible Edible Manchester.

This coming **Saturday 3 December**, these students are looking for more volunteers to help give the Moseley Road plot one last clean-up to get it looking smart before the Christmas break. So if you want to get involved, please sign up to volunteer via the **Volunteering Hub**. To do so, please:
