Making the most of your day

Thank you for choosing to attend The University of Manchester's undergraduate open day. By visiting our campus you will be able to gain a real insight into the student experience and life here.

You will have the opportunity to find out more about the courses you are interested in, meet current staff and students, as well as attend sessions on key issues such as accommodation and student finance. We hope you enjoy your visit.

There is no need to register on the day itself, just head to the first session you want to attend.

Stage 1

Decide which subject sessions you want to attend – you can attend more than one, so just look at the timetable on pages 2-13 to see which ones suit you best.

You can also find out more about your subject by visiting the relevant Subject Exhibition Stand. These are listed in the tinted boxes on pages 2-13. The stands will be open from 10am - 3.30pm and will provide you with the opportunity to speak with staff and current students on the course.







Visitors with disabilities or special requirements



These are our tips on making the most out of your day:
