# ABOUT THE NATIONAL COLLABORATIVE OUTREACH PROGRAMME (NCOP)

Greater Manchester Higher are delivering the government-funded NCOP programme in Greater Manchester. The overall aim of the NCOP programme is to work towards the government's goal of doubling participation in HE amongst disadvantaged groups by 2020. The programme is collaborative, impartial and targeted.

The programme contains several elements: on campus activities, in-school activities, CPD, mentoring, summer schools, subject-specific activity, projects and bespoke activity. The programme was developed in consultation with teachers, advisors and other stakeholders.

#### **ADDED VALUE**

All of our activities are free, and funding is available to meet transport costs for schools eligible for the NCOP programme.

Schools working with Greater Manchester Higher can meet their Ofsted objectives by supporting learners to make 'choices about the next stage of their education (...) from impartial careers advice and guidance' and are ensuring learners are 'prepared for the next stage in their education, training or employment.'

They can also satisfy the following Gatsby benchmark: 'Encounters with further and higher education.'

#### **Targeting**

Our targeting is based upon learner postcodes. The government has identified electoral wards where HE participation is lower than expected based on KS4 attainment. Our work must focus on providing intensive activities with Y9-13 learners from these wards. Support with targeting is available from your hub manager (details on the reverse).

Schools eligible for the NCOP programme can access all of our events and activities. However, there are a limited number of Greater Manchester Higher activities for all schools across Y7-11 and these are included in this booklet.



#### Monitoring and evaluation

It is important that we demonstrate the success of our work. Therefore, we will need support to evaluate outcomes with learners to demonstrate our long-term impact.

# ON CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

These events all follow the same format and are hosted at one of the universities or colleges in the partnership.

#### Year 8-9 Choices Days

This one-day event introduces Y8-9 learners to the decisions that they will make throughout their education and encourages them to reflect on how their GCSE choices could impact their future. The event includes a workshop, campus quest and the opportunity to speak with current students from across the partnership. The learners will also see a drama performance as part of the day.

This event is only suitable for pupils who have not yet made their GCSE choices.

#### **Year 10 Student Experience Visit**

These visits provide learners with the opportunity to visit a university or college campus and gain an insight into student life. The visit will consist of a classroom-based workshop and a practical activity, which will explore the range of options available, introduce learners to the social aspect of HE provide age-appropriate information about student finance. Students will also go on a campus tour. Learners will work closely with current students from across the partnership to obtain first-hand information about studying at a higher level.

### IN SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

#### **Presentations and Workshops**

Delivered in your school, these sessions offer an insight in to various aspects of HE. Workshops (including Star Student Board Game) last 45 minutes – I hour and are suitable for groups of up to 30.

Workshops cover the same content as presentations and offer an opportunity to explore the subject matter further through interactive activities.

#### Support for IAG events

Greater Manchester Higher will attend IAG events to promote higher education to Y7-II learners in Greater Manchester. A member of staff or a student ambassador will attend your event with a stand and literature, offering general advice on progression routes and answering questions related to HE. Examples of events we might attend in your school include careers fairs, options evenings and post-I6 information evenings.

# YIO GO FURTHER MENTORING PROJECT

Mentoring is proven to work due to the level of intensity, personalisation and relationship development involved. Our Go Further mentoring programme was developed in consultation with learners. It is informed by the DOTS decision-making methodology.

A current HE student will come into your school to deliver a structured mentoring programme. The programme is delivered to a group of 8-10 learners over a 6-10 week period. Each session lasts 45 minutes – I hour, and ideally needs to take place in a quiet space with a whiteboard.

The programme can be adapted to suit the needs of your learners. The 6 core sessions cover the following topics:

- Building relationships and setting the scene
- Life after YII
- Intro to HE
- Decision making
- How to be an ace student
- Reflection and next steps

The additional 4 sessions cover the following topics:

- Self-awareness
- Post-16 options
- Student Finance and Student Life
- Well-being

Mentoring will be delivered across three cohorts:

# YIO SUMMER SCHOOLS

Summer schools are a programme of activity delivered over the course of a few days. They enable your learners to gain a further insight into HE through taking part in a number of experiential activities and getting to work with HE students and learners from other schools. Some of our summer schools have a residential element to them, where learners will get to stay in halls of residence. Learners who take part in summer schools have stated that their confidence has grown and it has positively influenced their decision-making.

Food and transport is provided for all summer schools (either every day for non-residential events, or on the first day and last day for non-residential activities). Bookings will be made by schools on behalf of individual learners.

All summer schools will take place between w/c 25th June 2018 and w/c 23rd July 2018. Details of our summer school programme will be released in the spring term. Reunion events will take place in the Autumn term of Y11.
