New Standard Course Structure for Blackboard

This will ensure that your courses are up-to-date with the latest information and links for staff and students and ensure that there is a consistent structure across Blackboard courses. eLearning Profile

A profile of elearning activity from the past year has recently been completed. It shows data of Blackboard usage trends and use of elearning tools across SEED. In brief,

- Blackboard student and staff activity show SEED is performing well, meeting the Faculty average or performing higher
- Use of innovative teaching technologies such as TurningPoint Responseware has increased and used in most disciplines
- Some disciplines are engaging in using multimedia tools such as podcasts and web conferencing tools: GoToMeeting
- SEED have a number of School innovators, who have won awards and contributed to Faculty events to share their work and best practice
