THE OFFER

The Cultural Explorers Programme provides a cultural entitlement worth £500 per class at no cost for all local Year Five learners to engage in an exciting outside-the-classroom learning experience in one of The University of Manchester's four cultural venues.

Year Five learners in the University's most local wards of Ardwick, Hulme, Moss Side, Rusholme, Longsight and City can take part in activities at Manchester Museum, the Whitworth, The John Rylands Library or Jodrell Bank Discovery Centre.

Every Year Five class in participating schools receives fully-funded transport to visit one of the four venues. In addition, classes have two options for activities at their chosen venue:

Option One: A workshop led by the venue. **Option Two:** Bespoke activities co-planned with specialist venue learning staff and led by class teachers. With £100 provided towards supply cover for planning time, this is a great opportunity for professional development.

Teachers involved in the programme are also invited to an annual collective professional development opportunity worth £200, usually in the summer term. Making a booking

All visiting children are given incentives to come on return visits with their families, to encourage local families to make use of these amazing cultural venues.






Manchester Museum

Explore an array of treasures from the natural world and the many cultures it is home to at Manchester Museum. Highlights include a T. Rex and fossils of other pre-historic creatures, ancient Egyptian artefacts and live amphibians and reptiles. Manchester Museum is the UK's largest university museum, hosting a collection of over 4.5 million objects. All of its collections are designated, by the government, as being of national and international importance.
