Please note when choosing the course units you wish to take you must ensure you choose:

- 120 credits overall (including any core courses)
- a minimum of 50 credits per semester
- a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- no more and no less credits than stated from each list
- As a joint honours student, you must ensure that you take a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 80 credits in each subject (CAHE/HIST). If you choose to take 40 credits in one subject of your Joint Honours programme, you must take a minimum of 60 credits in the other subject

NOTE ON HIST30970 HISTORY DISSERTATION:

- Students choosing to take HIST30970 must plan their dissertation research schedule appropriately, and in consultation from Welcome Week onwards with their appointed dissertation supervisor.
