1. TLSO website/policy and procedure changes – updated policy documents now available

Following notification of updates to various regulations and policies in the July Bulletin, we can confirm that the following updated documents are now available:

• Updates to Regulation XVIII: Student Complaints Procedure

In response to feedback from colleagues across the University, and as a result of the regular review of the University's procedure against the OIA Good Practice Framework, some minor amendments have been made to the Student Complaints Procedure, with the updated version to be implemented for the start of the new academic year. Updates to the Undergraduate Degree Regulations

Refusing assessment/referred assessment, paragraphs D13 and F23

Clarification that Examination Boards can refuse assessment, as well as referred assessment, on the grounds of a student's work and attendance. The addition of the word 'engagement' to clarify that students whose engagement with their programme has been unsatisfactory, can also be refused assessment or referred assessment.

Rescinding Degrees, paragraph J54

A new paragraph has been added to confirm that Integrated Masters students may request that their final year of study be disregarded in order to receive a Bachelors qualification, subject to certain conditions. New principles to support the process of rescinding degrees has been produced and appended to the <u>Guidance on Examination Boards</u>.

Posthumous awards, section M

Section M on Aegrotat Degrees has been updated to reference both 'Aegrotat' and 'posthumous' degrees.

o Considering classifications in the boundary zone, Appendix A

An amendment has been made to Appendix A: Consideration of Bachelor Degree students within the boundary zone by mark distribution regarding the criterion for increasing classifications in the boundary. This now clarifies that units at level 5 and 6 can be used within the 2/3 credit calculation, to increase classification within the boundary.

• Updates to the Postgraduate Taught Degree Regulations

An updated version of the Postgraduate Degree Regulations is now available (see http://documents.manchester.ac.uk/display.aspx?DocID=29208. The main updates as highlighted in July's Bulletin relate to the following:

Refusing assessment/referred assessment, paragraphs D11 and F22

As per the UG Degree Regulations, clarification has been provided that Examination Boards can refuse assessment, as well as referred assessment, on the grounds of a student's work and attendance. The addition of the word 'engagement' to clarify that students whose engagement with their programme has been unsatisfactory, can also be refused assessment or referred assessment.

Use of 20 credit units, paragraph E15

Paragraph E14 has been amended to confirm that the maximum number of credits which can be compensated is up to 40 credits at Masters level (rather than up to 30 credits) and up to 20 credits for a PG Certificate.

Posthumous awards, section I

Section I on Aegrotat Degrees has been updated to reference both 'Aegrotat' and 'posthumous' degrees.

• Updated Guidance on Examination Boards

As mentioned above, the 'Guidance on Examination Boards' has been updated to include a new Appendix 4, 'Principles for Rescinding Awards'. 2. Manchester Leadership Award is now renamed as the STELLIFY Award
