



Technical PhD Studentship

A PhD studentship is available to a Home, EU or international applicant who is a graduate from the School of Mechanical, Aerospace and Civil Engineering and who has previously been awarded an MSc in:

- Advanced Manufacturing Technology and Systems Management
- Aerospace Engineering
- Mechanical Engineering Design
- Reliability Engineering and Asset Management
- Structural Engineering
- Thermal Power and Fluid Engineering

Eligibility	<p>To be eligible for this funding opportunity, applicants must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a University of Manchester graduate of one of the School of MACE MSc courses listed above. • Have graduated since July 2012 • Have achieved an overall distinction in their MSc • Hold an academic offer for a PhD programme in Mechanical Engineering, Civil Engineering or Aerospace Engineering with a start date of January 2018 or April 2018. Applications should be made online and 'Technical PhD Studentship' should be stated in the 'Funding' part of the form.
Selection Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Academic ability • Research aptitude <p>This will be assessed via the documents submitted with your academic application (there is no separate funding application form). These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CV • Transcripts • Official References • Research Proposal
Closing date	<p>You must have an academic offer in place by 27th October 2017 in order to be considered for this funding.</p>
Funding & Fees	<p>The studentship duration is three years and includes: Fees (home £4,195 or standard international £21,000) Stipend at the RCUK standard rate (£14,553 in 2017/18)</p>
