

## Technical PhD Studentship

A PhD studentship is available to a Home, EU or international applicant who is a graduate from the School of Mechanical, Aerospace and Civil Engineering and who has previously been awarded an MSc in:

- Advanced Manufacturing Technology and Systems Management
- Aerospace Engineering
- Mechanical Engineering Design
- Reliability Engineering and Asset Management
- Structural Engineering
- Thermal Power and Fluid Engineering

Eligibility	To be eligible for this funding opportunity, applicants must:
	<ul> <li>Be a University of Manchester graduate of one of the School of MACE MSc courses listed above.</li> </ul>
	Have graduated since July 2012
	Have achieved an overall distinction in their MSc
	<ul> <li>Hold an academic offer for a PhD programme in Mechanical Engineering, Civil Engineering or Aerospace Engineering with a start date of January 2018 or April 2018. Applications should be made <u>online</u> and 'Technical PhD Studentship' should be stated in the 'Funding' part of the form.</li> </ul>
Selection Criteria	<ul><li>Academic ability</li><li>Research aptitude</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>This will be assessed via the documents submitted with your academic application (there is no separate funding application form). These include:</li> <li>CV</li> <li>Transcripts</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Official References</li> <li>Research Proposal</li> </ul>
Closing date	You must have an academic offer in place by 27 <sup>th</sup> October 2017 in order to be considered for this funding.
Funding & Fees	The studentship duration is three years and includes: Fees (home £4,195 or standard international £21,000) Stipend at the RCUK standard rate (£14,553 in 2017/18)
