Provisional title for project: Tackling Child Abuse

Tackling child sexual exploitation and abuse is a priority for the Home Office. To better understand the scale of the offences being reported to the police, the Home Office has recently asked police forces to flag crimes for child sexual abuse or exploitation. The project will entail an in-depth analysis of these data to better understand the nature of these crimes being reported to the police, such as the specific offence types, any information on characteristics of victims and whether the crimes have an on-line element. The project could also extend to looking at the police response.
