PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any core courses)
- a minimum of 50 credits per semester
- a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- no more and no less credits than stated from each list
- As a joint honours student, you must ensure that you take a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 80 credits in each subject (CAHE/HIST). If you choose to take 40 credits in one subject of your Joint Honours programme, you must take a minimum of 60 credits in the other subject.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- ✓ The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code e.g. CAHE30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1 and '2' indicates Semester 2.
- ✓ To enrol on any of the course units outlined in your programme structure use the Self Service area of Campus Solutions.
