## RECYCLING



### Lesser-known campus recycle bins

The AMBS Business School cafe has recycle bins for storage media eg audio & video cassettes, floppy discs, CDs, DVDs (not USBs nor hard drives) & there is a CD & DVD recycling box outside The Foodcourt in Uni Place

The student-run Want Not Waste (WnW) shop in the SU recycles energy saving lightbulbs (& Ikea recycles low energy bulbs & strip lighting, usually by customer services desk, & most B&Q stores recycle all lightbulb types)

Tetrapak cartons - rinse & remove cap. Recycle cartons with cardboard. Recycle plastic caps via UoM plastic bottle recycle bins

Put non-food waste polystyrene by any UoM indoor set of bins to recycle

Recycle vapes via retailer recycle bins as the Uni Place/library ones cost us £++ to empty. NEVER put in general waste as lithium batteries cause fires

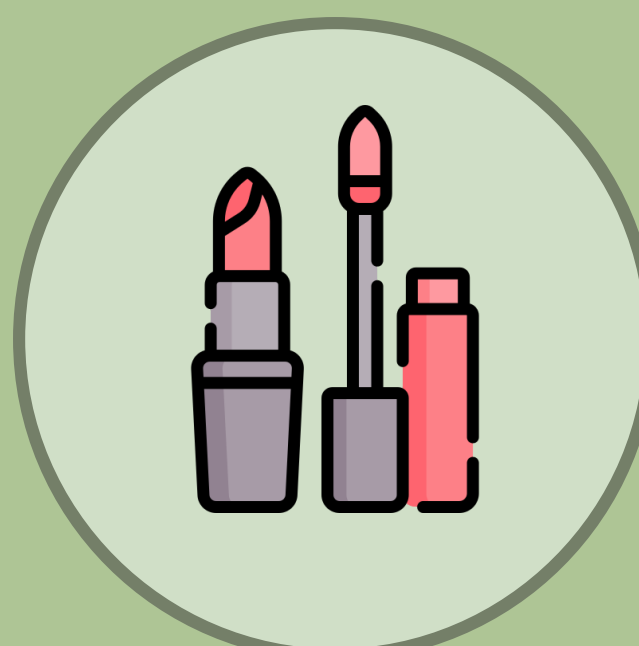


## Medicine blister pack recycling




The UoM AMBS cafe, some  &  stores with pharmacies recycle empty medicine blister packs (& no app registration is necessary for any of these schemes)


Unwanted medication & used inhalers can be safely disposed of +/- recycled at any high street pharmacy



## Recycling make-up



 &  & some Tesco's & Sainsbury's & M&S stores recycle any make-up brand & empty toothpaste tubes via instore collection boxes; excludes make-up brushes, nail polish & aerosols. You can deposit in Boots without using the Boots App

 recycle all perfume bottles, plant a tree for each & give 15% discount for that day

## Glasses

# Recycling hard & soft plastics



**NB You must clean these pre-recycling!**

All Greater Manchester councils collect plastic pots & trays from kerbside/ homes in the mixed recycle bins, eg yoghurt pots, margarine tubs, punnets

The Want Not Waste shop recycles biscuit/cracker/sweet wrappers, some razors/razor blades & make-up, & the proceeds go to

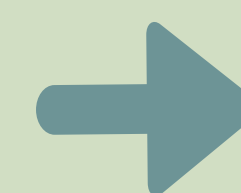
The Co-op opposite the RNCM is nearest to the main campus & the UoM AMBS cafe has a recycle bin for crisp/snack packets

Fallowfield & Hazel Grove  have small plastics recycle bins reportedly for all types of plastic, near the tills

**pets at home**



selected stores collect clean empty plastic pet food pouches for recycling



Plastic Shed in Stockport recycle clean PVC Type 3 vinyl banners, plastic lids (only HDPE Type2, LDPE Type4, PP Type5) & LDPE Type 4 soft plastics, <https://www.plasticshed.org/plastic-drop-off>



Green Coop bags made of potato starch (labelled 'EN13432') are compostable & can be used in domestic Greater Manchester council compost caddies, & their green food/ garden waste bins (but not in UoM caddies which go for anaerobic digestion) & never put them into soft plastics recycling bins!

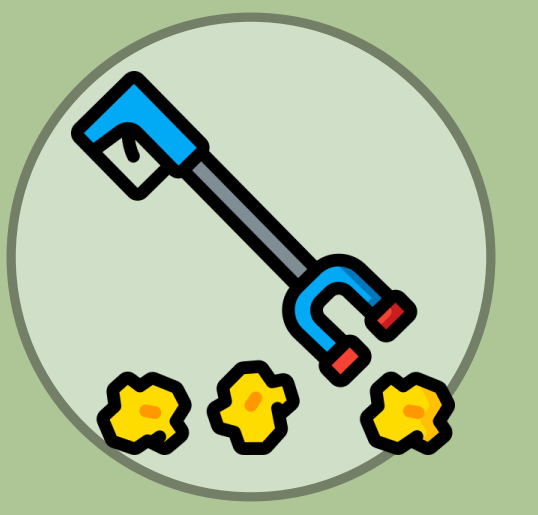

Donate clothing, shoes, books, CDs, DVDs, kitchenware & small working electrical goods to the British Heart Foundation collection points

NB Neither charity takes duvets or pillows - but Dunelm Mill shops do as part of their textile reuse/recycling scheme

**TOO GOOD TO WASTE**  
HOW TO DONATE USING OUR POST-BACK TRIAL

When you are donating your items, make sure to separate good condition and reusable clothing and textiles from anything damaged or in poor condition. These items can still be donated! Just pop them in a separate bag before they go in the postal bag.  
Use the handy guide below to find out which of your donations go in each bag...

→ <b>POSTAL BAG</b> <b>'WEARABLE' CLOTHES &amp; TEXTILES</b> <small>Clothes and textiles that are no longer wanted but could be worn by someone else. <b>STILL NOT SURE? ARE THEY:</b> Clean, dry, in good condition, ready to wear.</small>		
→ <b>SEPARATE BAG</b> <b>'UNWEARABLE' CLOTHES &amp; TEXTILES</b> <small>Clothes and textiles that can't be worn or used again but could be recycled or used to help mend something else. <b>STILL NOT SURE? ARE THEY:</b> Torn, stained, marked, stretched, shrunk, damaged, broken.</small>		
→ <b>NOT FOR DONATION</b> <b>WASTE/CONTAMINATED TEXTILES</b> <small>Clothes or non-clothing items that are soiled (dirty, wet, contaminated) and could contaminate other textiles and prevent them from being reused and recycled.</small>		

Alternatively, Oxfam & M&S are trialling a free postal donation scheme for clean but unwearable clothing

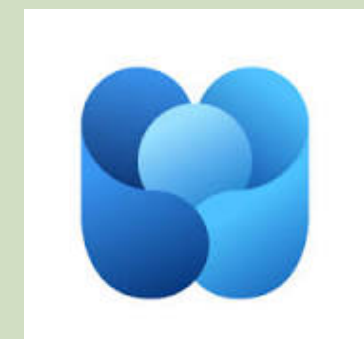

# Reduce plastics in the lab

SCAN ME

Full approach

Review

- Procurement.** Use sustainable products or suppliers, negotiate the purchase of kit components separately, and packaging options.
- Take stock and share:** only order what is needed .
- Protocol.** Are all steps needed? Could a new protocol be more sustainable?
- Layout.** Optimise sharing of material, reduce waste opportunities, optimise recycling.

Reduce Replace

- Can you create reagents/kits in house?
- Can you use products or equipment that reduce plastic?
- Can you downsize plastic containers?
- Do you need all these samples, dilutions, gloves?
- Could more be shared between classes/labs?
- Consider replacing with alternatives (paper, wood, glass), but check sustainability.

Reuse Refill

- Consider reusing gloves, tips, tubes, cuvettes, pipettes, weighing boats and refilling containers.
- Can you rinse or wash between uses? Could someone else reuse it?
- Consider in house protocol/equipment to decontaminate, wash, sterilise.
- Could you repurpose it?

Recycle

- Packaging:** Do we recycle it? If not, can it be sent back? Benefits from bulk buying?
- Are you following the guidelines for management of contaminated/non contaminated plastic?
- Could you recycle more with more organisation?
