



Lesser-known campus recycle bins


CD & DVD recycling box outside The Market Foodcourt in University Place; locations on the sustainability map: http://ow.ly/Mq4150yJ5Jp

The student-run Want Not Waste (WnW) shop recycles energy saving lightbulbs (& most B&Qs recycle all lightbulb types)

Tetrapak cartons - rinse & remove cap. Recycle cartons with cardboard. Recycle plastic caps via UoM plastic bottle recycle bins

Place non-food waste polystyrene next to any UoM indoor set of bins for recycling. See https://estates.manchester.ac.uk/services/operational services/envsvcs/waste/polystyreneepsrecycling/

Please recycle vapes via retailer recycle bins; the Uni Place/library ones cost UoM £+ to empty. Never put in general waste as lithium batteries cause fires

Small electricals






Medicine blister pack recycling





stores with pharmacies recycle empty medicine blister packs

Unwanted medication & used inhalers can be safely disposed of +/or recycled at any high street pharmacy



Recycling make-up







recycle any make-up brand & empty toothpaste tubes via instore collection boxes; excludes make-up brushes, nail polish & aerosols. Can deposit without using the Boots App. recycle all perfume bottles, plant a tree for each & give 15% discount for that day

UoM WnW also recycle make-up




Glasses



UoM Optometry no longer collects glasses for recycling/teaching purposes

Selected Specsavers stores eg Stretford, Mcr Arndale, have recycle bins for glasses, cases & contact lenses www.specsavers.co.uk/glasses/recycling

Or donate glasses' cases to charity shops & shelters, or repurpose as eg USB/charger lead/headphone carriers, mini 1st aid kit carriers etc



Recycling hard & soft plastics



NB You must clean these pre-recycling!

The Want Not Waste shop recycles biscuit/cracker/sweet wrappers, razors, razor blades & make-up, & the proceeds go to Amind Manchester *but they no longer collect bread bags, crisp packets, cheese wrappers, toothpaste tubes, toothbrushes, contact lenses & medicine blister packs*



Fallowfield & Hazel Grove Sainsbury's have small plastics recycle bins reportedly for all types of plastic, near the tills

pets at home selected stores collect clean empty plastic pet food pouches for recycling






Plastic Shed in Stockport recycle clean PVC Type 3 vinyl banners, plastic lids (only HDPE Type2,LDPE Type4,PP Type5) & LDPE Type 4 soft plastics, https://www.plasticshed.org/plastic-drop-off



Green Co-op bags made of potato starch (labelled 'EN13432') are compostable & can be used in domestic Greater Manchester council compost caddies, & their green food/garden waste bins.

NB Never put into soft plastics recycling bins!

To order domestic Manchester City Council recycling bins/bags/ caddies, check your bin day & learn what is recyclable at home/ kerbside, visit https://www.manchester.gov.uk/recycling

Dobbies Garden Centres recycle any clean plastic plant pots & trays https://www.dobbies.com/pot-recycling. B&Q also recycle clean plastic plant pots. Both recycle clean broken plastic pots.



Coffee cup recycling




Food on Campus are soon launching a reusable coffee cup scheme

Reusables are preferable, but Pret a Manger, Costa Coffee, Caffe Nero & McDonalds recycle any brand of disposable paper coffee cup in-store: https://www.cuprecyclingscheme.co.uk/where-to-recycle-paper-cups

The 3rd floor of the Core Technology Facility on Grafton Street set up their own collection point. Set one up yourself or use reusable cups.

Moving accommodation?

This is a city-wide charity involving Manchester students, giving items to the British Heart Foundation & Manchester Central Foodbank

Donate clothing, shoes, books, CDs, DVDs, kitchenware & small working electrical goods to the British Heart Foundation collection points

Donate unopened, non-perishable, in-date food items eg long-life milk, pasta, rice, soup, beans to the food donation points







Cycling & running

Avoid brain damage or worse: please <u>always</u> wear a bike helmet & high-vis clothing, stop at red lights, indicate & use bike-lights at night

UoM sometimes subsidises good D-style bike locks for staff & students. See https://www.estates.manchester.ac.uk/services/security/ourservices/crimereduction/cyclesecurity. Oil locks every fortnight to stop rust!

Staff & postgrads can access all campus bike shelters if they visit the Car Parking Office (Room G.002 Beyer Bldg) & get their staff card activated

Reduce plastics in the lab





Review

- Procurement. Use sustainable products or suppliers, negotiate the purchase of kit components separately, and packaging options.
- Take stock and share: only order what is needed.
- Protocol. Are all steps needed?
 Could a new protocol be more sustainable?
- Layout. Optimise sharing of material, reduce waste opportunities, optimise recycling.



Reduce Replace



- Can you create reagents/kits in house?
- Can you use products or equipment that reduce plastic?
- Can you downsize plastic containers?
- Do you need all these samples, dilutions, gloves?
- Could more be shared between classes/labs?
- Consider replacing with alternatives (paper, wood, glass), but check sustainability.



Reuse Refill



- Consider reusing gloves, tips, tubes, cuvettes, pipettes, weighing boats and refilling containers.
- Can you rinse or wash between uses? Could someone else reuse it?
- Consider in house protocol/equipment to decontaminate, wash, sterilise.
- Could you repurpose it?



Recycle


- Packaging: Do we recycle it? If not, can it be sent back? Benefits from bulk buying?
- Are you following the guidelines for management of contaminated/non contaminated plastic?
- Could you recycle more with more organisation?


