Project Outline

Recruitment of additional police officers is a top priority for the Government and will support the police to tackle crime and keep our communities safe. The Prime Minister's commitment to recruit 20,000 additional officers by 2023 will see the biggest police recruitment drive in decades. On the 4th September 2019 the Chancellor announced £750m of new funding for 2020/21 for policing to begin delivery of the government's commitment. An immediate £45m was awarded to kick-start the recruitment of up to 6,000 additional police officers by the end of March 2021 with the remaining 14,000 to be recruited in the following 2 years.

The Home Office are currently developing a programme of work around the recruitment and deployment of these new officer and will also need to measure the impact that these new officer are having on crime and on communities. The work is still evolving but this role will be high profile and interesting. They need someone who is happy to work with and manipulate data, to update the team with findings and to generally support the uplift programme team. The successful candidate will receive training and support to fulfil this role.
