### **Project Outline**

Quantitative and qualitative analysis of the record forms of calls to the Salesforce database; for Respect's two helplines: Respect Phoneline (for male or female perpetrators) and Men's Advice Line (male victims of domestic violence) over the last 12-month period.

### **Application Criteria**

#### Essential

- Excellent anaytical skills
- Ability to understand the impact of domestic violence.
- Interest in the work Respect does, Helplines in particular
- Understanding of the strengths and limitations of quantitative data.
- Ability to formulate different narratives based on the data analysis and identifying the most realistic one.
- Good writing skills.
- Willingness to work collaboratively.

#### Desirable

- Experience of SPSS and how to transfer from one platform to another. Respect's database is currently on the website database provision by salesforce.com using a custom-built database they designed.
   Data can be exported to Excel then to SPSS.
- Knowledge of the research terrain on domestic and initimate partner violence, particularly the debates about the connection between gender and intimate partner violence, or willingness and ability to understand and work with the complexity.
