



Principles of Rounding

With respect to the rounding and display of marks, SALC will apply the following principles:

- i. The mark awarded for each individual piece of coursework for a module will consist of a single integer consistent with the details set out in SALC's stepped marking procedures.
- ii. The mark awarded for each individual piece of non-written assessment (including assessment of presentations, oral assessment or assessment of contribution in seminars) will consist of a single integer consistent with the details set out in SALC's stepped marking procedures.
- iii. In cases where there is more than one component to an individual piece of coursework, the following procedure would be applied: (a) individual marks for each component would be provided in the feedback, consistent with the details set out in SALC's stepped marking procedure and (b) an overall (integer) mark, will be awarded for that piece of coursework. Should this mark be calculated to a decimal place, rounding should be applied.
- iv. The mark awarded for the examination element of a module should be given to one decimal place.
- v. The aggregated overall mark awarded for the module (the summation of the weighted components) should be rounded into a single overall integer.

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
