

## **FREE CHOICE COURSE UNITS**

You may apply to your Programme Director for permission to take 20 units of free choice course units.

When selecting your free choice unit from outside the School of Social Sciences, please check the course web pages for the courses you are interested in and to check the following requirement:

- Does the course unit have any co and/or pre-requisites?
- Are there restrictions on the course unit and/or is it open to BSc Economics students as a free choice?
- Can you enrol on the course immediately OR do you have to complete an application form and have it signed by the School/Discipline that runs the course unit?
- When does the other Schools course unit selection open for enrolment? (Course Unit Selection for such free choice units may take place earlier, or later, than School of Social Sciences so check the dates carefully).

Please check the above before contacting your Programme Director for permission to take the unit.

## **LANGUAGE COURSES (LEAP)**

If you wish to sign up for a language course, you will be allocated according to the level you have already attained – beginner, intermediate, advanced.
