

Quick Guide: Teaching and Learning Resources

You can find the resources you need to develop or re-develop your teaching practices for online, blended or flexible learning across the University.

The Institute of Teaching and Learning has collated a range of resources for the initial move online on the Teaching Remotely website.

For longer term teaching development, and in preparation for the 2020-2021, the Institute website is being updated regularly with advice and resources to support your teaching practice.

The Institute also facilitates a peer community for all teaching staff. Please join our Teaching and Learning Online Network (TALON) on Yammer.

The Library is developing approaches for integrated programme level support to ensure students have equitable access to its learning and specialist resources and expertise. They are also putting together updated guidance around copyright and online learning materials and to support delivery of teaching online.

Media Services provide support on the use of Zoom, and a range of guidance and training on media production techniques for teaching.



The **Faculty of Science and Engineering** Teaching College and Academy has developed a range of resources, regularly updated including weekly videos, short courses and examples of blended learning design.

Our Faculties have put together a range of useful resources that they recommend to colleagues locally. These may also be useful to colleagues in other parts of the University
