- c. BMAN 73692 Sustainable Supply Chain Management
- The following modules must be focused on a **procurement and/or supply chain** topic
 - a. BMAN 70120 Professional Skills: Research and Evaluation Methods
 - b. BMAN 61082 Dissertation in Operations and Supply Chain Management
- The dissertation associated with this programme must be on a procurement and/or supply chain specific topic (general management topics will not be accepted) and submitted to CIPS for review as part of the MCIPS application process.
- All modules **must** be passed with no compensations or exemptions

Students are entitled to take one elective over the year from another MSc provided by Alliance Manchester Business School, as long as a 200 word explanation is provided and the consent of the unit coordinator and the programme director is obtained. This is by arrangement, and subject to timetabling and student's background.
