Black History Month has been celebrated in the UK in October for over 30 years. It provides an ideal opportunity to engage with diverse communities to promote equality, understanding and respect. A variety of events take place all over the country celebrating people's lives and cultures. Sir Arthur Lewis (1915 - 1991) was a Professor in Economics at the University of Manchester between 1948 and 1956. The Arthur Lewis Building was opened at the University in 2007 recognising his achievements in the field of economics. Economics was not his first choice as he revealed in his autobiography 'I never meant to be an economist...I wanted to be an engineer, but neither the colonial government nor the sugar plantations would hire a black engineer'. As one of the first black professors employed at the University Sir Arthur Lewis overcame many obstacles and achieved a great deal in his personal and professional life. Winning the Nobel Prize in Economics in 1979, he became the first black person to win a Nobel Prize in a category other than peace.
