	Meningitis C and MMR vaccinations If you have not already received
	these vaccinations, it is strongly recommended that you get them before coming to the UK. Meningitis C and MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) are rare but serious diseases which can be easily spread around students living in close proximity. If you are unable to access the vaccines in your home country, you can get them from your GP (doctor) in the UK.
	Create a Facebook account www.facebook.com . Facebook is the most
	popular social networking site in the UK. Most students use it to communicate with each other and plan events. Facebook is often how student societies give information to their members and the Orientation Programme even has its own official Facebook page www.facebook.com/manchesterorientation . Don't worry if you can't access Facebook in
	your home country, it is easy to set up an account once you arrive in the UK. The University's Medical and Human Science Faculty has produced <u>guidance</u> on using social networks safely and appropriately and we would advise all students to have a look at this.
	Create a Twitter account www.twitter.com. Another popular social media
	site is Twitter. This site is used by a lot of University Services, such as the Careers Service and the Library, to give out information to students. You can get the latest updates to the Orientation Programme on twitter at http://twitter.com/OrientationUoM
	Begin (and maybe complete) registration It is essential to
	complete University registration to become a member of the University and be able to access lectures and University facilities. You can start, and depending on how you are paying your tuition fees maybe even finish, the registration process from home from 1 st September 2011.
