Registration

- **Registration** is the process by which formally you become a member of the University. You have to reregister at the start of each year of your programme of study or research.
- As a registered student of the University of Manchester:
 - You must attend all compulsory lectures, laboratory classes, seminars, tutorials, supervision sessions relevant to your programme.
 - You have access to the University's learning and student support facilities and services, physical and virtual e.g., IT, Library.
 - You have membership of the Students' Union and are entitled to council tax exemption. Your student card is evidence of your status as a student. It is also your library card and provides swipe access to many University buildings. Keep it safe it will cost £10 to replace.



Steps to registration (1) To register for the first time you must have

- Confirmed your attendance via self service in Campus Solutions depending on whether you are an undergraduate or a postgraduate at either www.manchester.ac.uk/undergraduate/confirmation or www.manchester.ac.uk/postgraduare/howtoapply/confirm
- Received the IT Sign Up email sent to your personal email address and subsequently obtained your University IT account, including your central username (e.g., mfbxiskv) and password which you need to register.
- Received the University email inviting you to register via the Register icon at www.manchester.ac.uk



Steps to registration (2)

 Complete all 10 steps of registration, including confirmation of your personal and academic details, and payment or commitment to pay your tuition fees. If you, or a member of your family is paying your tuition fees your payment options are:

Payment in full or part payment online by debit or credit card as part of the registration process or *via* the registration helpline +44 (0)161 306 5544. American Express is not accepted.

Cheques and banker's drafts for full or part payment made payable to *The University of Manchester* must be taken to the Whitworth Hall between 15 – 28 September (inclusive).

Direct Debit for three equal instalments paid from a UK bank account and set up online as part of the registration process. The first instalment has to be paid at registration with two subsequent payments on 19 January and on 19 April.

Steps to registration (3)

- A letter from the University to enable you to open a UK bank account can be obtained from one of our student card issue venues (detailed on the following slide).
- If your tuition fees are to be paid by third party e.g., your government or a commercial sponsor and this is not displayed when you go online to register please take your sponsor letter to the Whitworth Hall between 15 28 September (inclusive).
- A late payment charge of £50 will be levied if you have not completed your registration by 30 September, rising to £200 if you are still not registered by 10 October.



Steps to registration (4)

- If you have not completed any part of IT Sign up or registration you can do so at one of our computer clusters e.g., George Kenyon Building which is staffed by Purple People.
- On successful completion of all 10 steps of registration you must submit your passport and Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) (if issued) for scanning and collect your student card at one of the following venues:

Once you are registered (1)

- You must familiarise yourself with the University rules and regulations with which you must comply. They are available at: www.studentnet.manchester.ac.uk/crucial-guide/regulations and include details regarding your registration and the payment of your tuition fees, compulsory work and attendance requirements, your conduct and discipline, Library and computer use and misuse. Those specific to your degree will be set out in your course handbook which is usually available online.
- Many administrative processes are carried out online e.g., course unit selection, examination timetables. Therefore, you must access the student portal and your University email account regularly for important notices and updates.
