HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF OUR IT SYSTEMS

Your help is needed to deliver new and improved online services for staff and postgraduate research students.

Over the coming months, IT Services will be developing a whole range of online tools which are focused on helping us to do our jobs more effectively and efficiently.

To make sure that what's being developed is user-friendly and of real value, a group of staff and postgraduate research students are needed to test early versions of new systems and to get your ideas and feedback.

Professor Chris Taylor, who is Associate Vice-President for Research, is leading the team working on the IT improvements and said: "We've all experienced the frustrations of not being able to find the information we need easily, the inconvenience of logging in to numerous different

systems daily, or having to manually do things that could easily be done online.

"In fact staff surveys and feedback clearly tell us that improvements are needed.

"We're looking to produce a collection of streamlined online tools which will focus on the actual task you're trying to do, instead of concentrating on the mechanics of how to do it.

"Some systems will be new, in other cases we'll be improving existing systems. So we need staff to get involved at the development stage, so that we can take your thoughts, needs and comments on board."

REFLECTIONS ON LEARNING

The Alan Gilbert Learning Commons is starting to take shape with construction continuing apace.

At the moment, the new windows are being installed and the project is still on track to open this autumn.

Open 24 hours a day, seven days a week (with reduced hours over the summer according to student demand), students will be able to satisfy all their study needs under one roof.

Over 1,000 learning spaces will be available, including group study rooms (with plasma screens, movable white boards, IT equipment and soundproof walls) and open study areas (with a range of seating and tables), plus private spaces and quiet zones.

There will be a huge emphasis on technology, with over 400 computers, multiple areas to plug in laptops, phones and iPods, plasma screens, interactive whiteboards and wi-fi access.

PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

Each month in Staff Update we publish a summary of the President's weekly message, for staff that don't have access to email or the internet at work.



25 November

The President announced that the University had been awarded a Queen's Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education in the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Round (2010-12). The Prize was given for our: "World-leading applied research and skills training for the varied needs of the nuclear industry."

1 December

Two more awards were announced – both for the support we offer to young researchers – the Times Higher Education (THE) annual award and the SCOPUS award.

8 December

Manchester's cross-city bus scheme for Oxford Road has now been approved. This scheme aims to provide direct bus links across the city centre, supported by infrastructure to help cut journey times and improve reliability.

15 December

This message outlined the process for planning budgets for 2012/13 and five year forecasts. The

President said: "The change in the undergraduate fee structure means that we need a radical rethink of our budgeting within the University."

21 December

The President reported on a visit to Hong Kong to attend the inauguration of the Hong Kong Foundation of The University of Manchester. This is a formally constituted group of our senior alumni in Hong Kong, who are committed to supporting the University.

19 January 2012

This week's message talked about the latest meeting of the Greater Manchester Local Enterprise Partnership which discussed current funding initiatives - particularly funding from the European Development Fund, and how this can help Greater Manchester.

The meeting looked at how we can better promote the great history, current activity and potential for innovation for growth based on research in Greater Manchester.

RE-GRADING POLICY

A new re-grading policy and procedure has been launched for all non-academic and non-research staff between grades 1 and 8.

Before you make an application, you should speak to your line manager. If you want to go forward, then complete the HERA Role Outline form and pass this to your manager with a copy of your job description.

Applications will be considered by a HERA Role Analyst and outcomes submitted to the University's HR sub-committee for approval that the policy has been applied correctly and consistently.

PAY DEDUCTION

The University is entitled to withhold pay for staff who took strike action on Wednesday 30 November 2011. Pay will be deducted at 1/260th of annual salary and the deduction will be made in the February payroll.

SEE YOUR PAYSリップ ONLINE

If you want to see your payslip online or update your personal details, you can do this using MyView.

MyView is an online system which is easy to use and you can be sure that the information held about you is safe, because there's an added level of security built into the system.

- You can use MyView to update your:
 - Home address
 - Phone numbers
 - Emergency contacts

You must make sure that you press 'submit' to make sure that the changes you make feed straight into the University's Human Resources system. This means that there's no need to contact HR, or fill in paper forms when you change your contact details.

- You can use MyView to look at:
 - Payslips
 - Bank details
 - Contact addresses

To start using MyView you'll need to create a passphrase which is different to your usual username and password. This added level of security has been built into MyView to make sure that your personal information is kept safe and secure.

You'll only have to create your passphrase the first time you use MyView. There's an online step-by-step guide to creating your passphrase on StaffNet:

2011/12 PAY OFFER

The 2011/12 pay offer of £150 uplift to each pay point across the single spine is being implemented.

At the national negotiating level, the UCU and GMB trade unions have reluctantly accepted the offer from the employers; Unison has 'noted' the offer and Unite has confirmed its position of neither noting nor agreeing the offer.

Against this background, the University is advised by the national employers association (UCEA) that the 2011/12 pay round has concluded as far as it is possible to do so, and it is our intention to implement the consolidated increase of £150 on each spine point.

HEALTH AND SAFETY – COURSES AVAILABLE

Nothing is more important than our health and wellbeing. With this in mind there are a host of Health and Safety courses available that cover a range of topics from H&S good practice to First Aid workshops and recognised qualifications.

First Aid Training courses include:

- **First Aid Awareness with Basic Life Support (half day introductory workshop)**
 - **First Aid for Specialised burns (half day training session)**
- Other first aid workshops can be arranged on a bespoke basis if required**

There are also **H.S.E. approved training courses and qualifications** for staff that are going to provide first aid cover for their area:

- **H.S.E. approved Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) (1 day)**
- **H.S.E. approved First Aid at Work (FAAW) (3 days)**
