**PLEASE NOTE: After completing your selection, you must ensure that you have chosen:**

- a total of 120 credits
- a minimum of 100 credits at Level 2 or higher
- a minimum of 40 credits in each named subject
- a minimum of 50 credits per semester
- a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- no more or no less credits as stated from each list

Course unit enrolment checks are completed from start of teaching until the end of week two. Students who have not following the guidance within the programme structure could find that units they wish to take are no longer available.

Please complete all 4 steps to enrol in the required **120 credits** for your programme of study:-

**Steps 1 & 2** will be completed for you automatically by your Programmes Administration Team (40 credits)

**Step 3** you MUST choose a minimum of 20 credits from the list of available options (20-60 credits)

**Step 4** you MUST choose a minimum of 20 credits of optional Business Course Units from the list of available options (20-60 credits)

### ADDITIONAL NOTES:

In order to progress to the third year of the programme, it is necessary to pass your compulsory core language unit with a mark of 40 or above. It is also necessary to pass at least 60 more credits with a mark of 40 or above, and a further 40 credits with a mark of 30 or above. You must pass at least 40 credits at the first attempt (i.e. not through resits). Please see your School Handbook for more information.

**Step 5:** Subject to the approval of the UG Programme Director and fulfilment of the steps outlined above, students at Level 2 are permitted to take a maximum of 20 credits free choice. **PLEASE NOTE** - when selecting your free choice course unit:

- Please note where a UCOL (University College) unit is a language unit, the LEAP rules below apply.
- MLBM Spanish students may take one LEAP language unit (20 credits) as free choice in either or both of the second and final years, as long as in any one year no more than three languages are studied. However, a LEAP language unit may only be taken as a free choice unit in the final year if a prerequisite LEAP unit in the SAME language has been taken in the second year. You must apply directly with the LEAP office in order to take a LEAP language unit. (Your performance on this unit will be monitored, and, where relevant, you may be advised to discontinue with the study of a third language in the subsequent year of study at the recommendation of your Academic Advisor or Programme Director.)

### **Important Notes**

- **At least 100 of the total of 120 credits must be at Level 2 (i.e. course units whose code numbers begin with the number 2, e.g. BMAN22000), but up to 20 of the 120 credits can be at Level 1.**
- **No more than ONE** of the following units may be taken during your MLBM programme: BMAN20022 Career Development, CARS22012 Career Management Skills, SALC20401 Careers & Project Management for Arts, Languages and Cultures, SALC20402 Careers & Project Management for Arts, Languages and Cultures.
- Note that **only ONE** of UCOL20021, UCOL20022 Leadership in Action (10 credits) and UCOL20020 Leadership in Action (20 credits) may be chosen.
- **Note that some final year courses have Level 2 courses as prerequisites.** Please see the 'MLBM Economics Guide' and the 'MLBM Accounting and Finance Guide' for details.
