PLEASE NOTE - when selecting your free choice course unit:

- That the course unit is at Level 2 or Level 3, with the following exception:
 - You may take a maximum 20 credits at Level 1 within your named subject areas. Please note, if you
 have already chosen a Level 1 unit in one of the previous steps, you can only choose a Level 2 or 3 unit
 as free choice.
- LEAP course units (apply directly through the LEAP office) may only be taken at Level 2 or Level 3 (provided that no more than three languages are studied in any one year), with the following exception:
 - You may take Level 1 LEAP Korean in your second year as your 20 credits of free choice; if this option is chosen in Year 2, then in your final year you may continue with the study of Korean at Level 2. You are advised that, if you take this option then you may not take any other course unit at Level 1 in the steps above
- Only the 10-credit LEAP Tandem course unit running in semester 1 is permitted in ONE of your named languages in second year.
