6: Subject to the approval of the UG Programme Director and fulfilment of the steps outlined above, students at Level 2 are permitted to take a maximum of 20 credits free choice. PLEASE NOTE - when selecting your free choice course unit:

- For subject areas in the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures and University College (UCOL), the course unit must be at Level 1, 2 or 3, (please note that this does not include LEAP units, see below). A maximum of 20 credits can be taken at Level 1.
 - Please note where a UCOL unit is a language unit (e.g. Arabic and Mandarin) the LEAP rules below apply.
- For subject areas elsewhere in the University, the course unit must be at Level 2 or 3.
- LEAP course units –must be at Level 2 or 3 (provided that no more than three languages are studied in any one year) and must be applied for directly with the LEAP office. Your performance on this unit will be monitored, and you may be advised to discontinue with the study of a third language in the subsequent year of study at the recommendation of your Academic Advisor or Programme Director.
 - Only the 10-credit LEAP Tandem course unit running in semester 1 is permitted in your own language of study in second year.
