### Regulations:

- All Level 2 HGERM students must take either a 20-credit Long Essay / Research Project (List A), and GERM51030 or GERM51040, as relevant. With agreement from both departments, the German Long Essay can be taken from List B, in addition to HIST20392 from List A.
- All Level 2 HGERM students must choose 80 additional credits of optional course units (Lists B-E)
- Level 2 HGERM students taking 80 credits of History based courses (i.e. not GERM courses) must include one premodern course unit from List E.

### After following Steps 1 to 5 below, all Level 2 HGERM students must have:

- Total selection of exactly 120 credits
- A maximum of 80 GERM coded modules
- A maximum of 80 credits of History modules, which can include HIST20392 and all modules listed in Lists C, D and E
- Minimum of 50 credits of course units in each semester
- Maximum of 70 credits of course units in each semester
- Course units whose lectures do not clash – **check the timetable**

### Note on Credit Allocation Across Semesters and HIST Independent Research Project:

- The semester in which a course unit is taught is identified by the last digit in the course code (e.g. HIST10101 = Sem. 1). A 0 (zero) final digit indicates the course unit is taught across both semesters
- When calculating your credit allocation by semester, the credits for 0- (zero) coded courses should usually be divided equally between Sem. 1 and Sem. 2

Please note that swapping or dropping full-year optional modules is prohibited after week 2 of semester 1.
