6: Subject to the approval of the UG Programme Director and fulfilment of the steps outlined above, students at Level 3 are permitted to take a maximum of 20 credits free choice. You can find the full list of free choice units from the Courses Tab within My Manchester login.manchester.ac.uk (List 000014151)

PLEASE NOTE - when selecting your free choice course unit:

- For subject areas in the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures and University College (UCOL), the course unit must be at Level 2 or 3, (please note that this does not include LEAP units, see below). A maximum of 20 credits can be taken at Level 2. Please note:
 - where a UCOL unit is a language unit (e.g. Arabic and Mandarin) the LEAP rules below apply.
 - if you have already chosen a Level 2 unit in one of the previous steps, you can only choose a Level 3 unit as free choice.
- For subject areas elsewhere in the University, the course unit must be at Level 3.
- LEAP course units – must be at Level 3 (provided that no more than three languages are studied in any one year) and must be applied for directly with the LEAP office.
 - Tandem LEAP course unit is NOT permitted in the final year except by the recommendation of the Residence Abroad and Exchange Committee.
