PLEASE NOTE - when selecting your free choice course unit:

- For subject areas in the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures and University College (UCOL), the course unit must be at Level 2 or 3, (please note that this does not include LEAP units, see below). A maximum of 20 credits can be taken at Level 2. Please note:
 - o where a UCOL unit is a language unit (e.g. Arabic and Mandarin) the LEAP rules below apply.
 - o if you have already chosen a Level 2 unit in one of the previous steps, you can only choose a Level 3 unit as free choice.
- For subject areas elsewhere in the University, the course unit must be at Level 3.
- LEAP course units must be at Level 3 (provided that no more than three languages are studied in any one year)

and must be applied for directly with the LEAP office.

 Tandem LEAP course unit is NOT permitted in the final year except by the recommendation of the Residence Abroad and Exchange Committee.
