Planning your day

In order to get the most from your day we recommend that you take time to plan your visit. There is a lot to see and do so we have included a visit planner at the back of this programme to make sure that you don't miss any of the sessions that you want to attend.

We do advise that where possible you arrive early to your sessions as some will be very popular, in these cases we may limit admittance to one student and one visitor or students only.

As you make your way through the programme and start to plan your day, you will see that next to the building names/session venues there is a number in brackets. This indicates the building number as listed on the campus map on pages 28-29 and will help you to navigate around our campus. If you are having any problems on the day in finding a building please ask a member of our Open Day Team dressed in purple, they will be happy to direct you.

Please note: We are constantly improving our campus so there might be areas undergoing refurbishment during our June Open Days.



STAGE 1

Decide what subject sessions you want to attend – you can attend more than one, so just look at the timetable on pages 3 to 15 to see which ones suit you best. If you are interested in Aerospace Engineering, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering or Medicine, you will need to have pre-booked your place via the online registration form.

You can also find out more about your subject by visiting the relevant Subject Exhibition Stand. These are listed in column three of the Subject Sessions on pages 3 -15. These will be open from 10am – 3.30pm and will provide you with the opportunity to speak with staff and current students on the course.

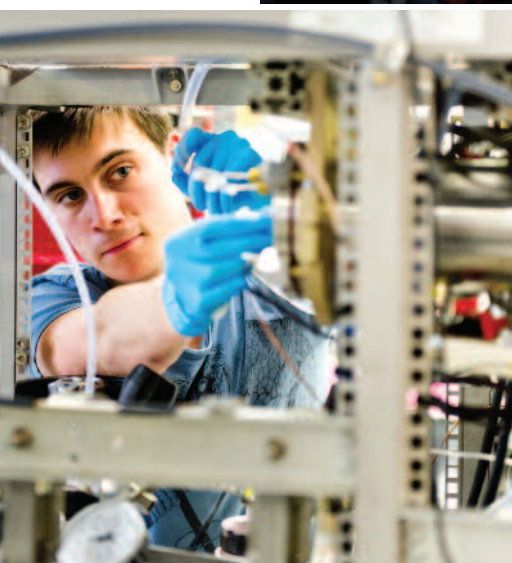
STAGE 3

Please note that on Friday 21 June the 147 bus service will be operating its normal route and passengers are advised to get off at the Booth Street bus stop. If you are attending on Friday 21 June you will be emailed a voucher for free travel on this service two weeks before the Open Day.

For visitors on Saturday 22 June, the 147 bus service will only be operating for the Open Day and will therefore only stop at Piccadilly Train Station and the University Campus (Brunswick Street). There is no voucher needed for travel on this day.

Due to local traffic and the popularity of the service, please allow 45 minutes for the journey.

A taxi ride from the station will take approximately 15 minutes and cost around £8.00.

Travelling from Victoria Station?

Victoria Station is approximately 10 minutes walk from Piccadilly Gardens. Here there are frequent bus services to the Oxford Road Campus. Services include the 41,42,43,142 and 143. Alternatively a tram service to Piccadilly Gardens is available from Victoria Station. You can then catch one of the bus services mentioned above.

Taxis are also available outside the station.

Travelling from Oxford Road Station?

To get to the Oxford Road Campus, go down the station approach to Oxford Road and turn right. The Campus is a 10 to 15 minute walk. Alternatively, you can catch a bus from outside the Palace Hotel to the Oxford Road Campus. Please speak to one of our Student Ambassadors who will be based at Oxford Road Station.

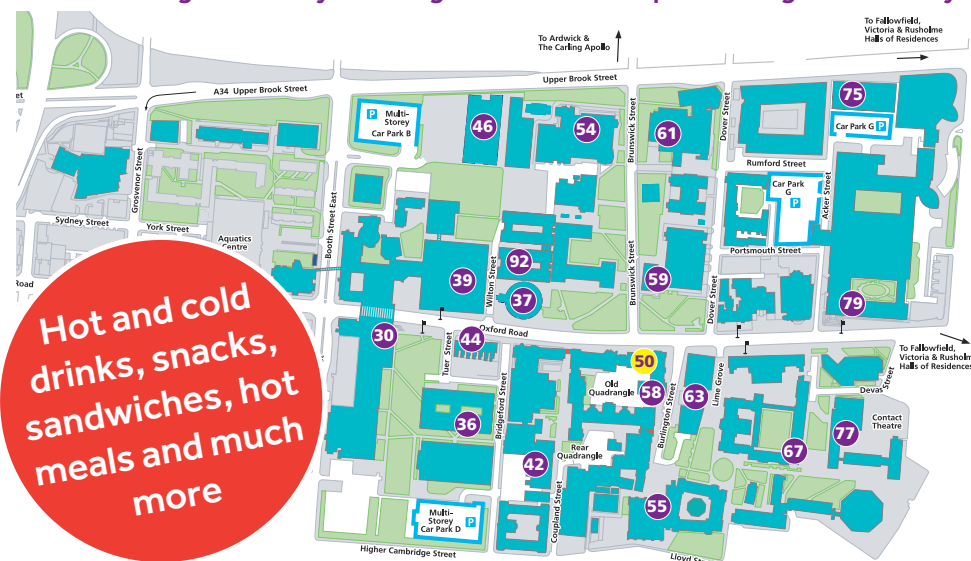

These are our tips on making the most out of your day:

- Our Open Days are very popular events and sessions can sometimes become full. To avoid disappointment we suggest where possible you arrive early.
- Check the programme to see when sessions occur for your subject of interest. You can attend sessions for more than one subject if you want to.

- Some subject sessions must be booked before the day. These are indicated on the registration form.
