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University Shuttle Service to Residences

Tuesday 10 September to Sunday 15 September

Manchester Airport: University Shuttle Service to Residences

Time: 0800 – 2130

Duration

Waiting time usually 1 hour maximum. Journey time is between 20 and 60 minutes depending on the Hall of Residence. The final destination is usually Whitworth Park.

The University runs a free coach shuttle service for new international students between Manchester Airport and all University accommodation sites. Priority on this service will be given to students arriving on their own.

Dates and times of the service

The service operates from Tuesday 10 to Sunday 15 September from 0800 to 2130 and stops at all University accommodation. If you are not sure whether you are living in University accommodation, please check the list of residences on the booking form. We run a very frequent service which means that you shouldn't have to wait much more than an hour before you can take your seat on the coach. However, at rush hour and very busy periods, buses can take longer to make the round trip so we would ask you to be patient. Journey time is between 20 and 60 minutes depending upon the hall.

How to use the service

You must book a place in advance online and bring your booking confirmation with you to the airport. Please note that this is a separate process from booking a place on the Orientation programme. www.manchester.ac.uk/international/arrival/travel/shuttle-service/booking-form

When you arrive at Manchester Airport, look out for our Student Ambassadors who will be wearing purple T-shirts with the University of Manchester logo. There will be Student Ambassadors in each terminal who will direct you to the airport bus station from where the University Shuttle Service to Residences coaches depart at regular intervals.

Travelling to your accommodation without using the University Shuttle Service to Residences

If you are travelling with family members or non-student friends, or are arriving outside of the University Shuttle Service to Residences times, you are advised to use public transport. Taxis are readily available outside the airport and cost approximately £25 to the city centre. Alternatively, there is a rail link direct from the airport to Manchester Piccadilly railway station in Manchester city centre. The cost of a single ticket is around £3.20.

Advice on travelling to the UK

The Arrival Guide, which you should have already received, contains information and advice on what to pack, what to expect at the airport and how to travel around Manchester. The Guide is also available to download from www.manchester.ac.uk/arrival

Please note: there are no porters available at Manchester Airport or at University accommodation so you will need to carry your own luggage.

Orientation PROGRAMME

Why should I come to Orientation?

We are delighted that you are coming to Manchester and we hope that your life and study here will be successful and enjoyable. In order to help you we have created an Orientation programme of talks and events to give you an understanding of University life, UK study skills and British culture. It is also a good opportunity to meet existing international and UK students and to make friends with other new students. Each of the activities and events at Orientation has been designed with the specific purpose of contributing to your success here;



You may see the same symbols used but with a pink border this means that the event is not exclusive to international and EU students, but is part of the Manchester Welcome for all new students. You are very much encouraged to take part and you can also invite your new friends from the UK to come along with you.

Are there any sessions that I should definitely attend?

We strongly recommend that all students attend one of the core presentation sessions on Friday 13, Saturday 14 or Sunday 15 September. Apart from this session, you are free to choose workshops, trips and social events to suit your interests and questions. ERASMUS, Study Abroad and Exchange and Science without Borders students must attend a mandatory briefing session. See page 6

Can I bring friends and family to the events?

You are very welcome to bring adult friends or family to any of the events apart from the core sessions where we will need to limit the audience to the new students only in order to make sure that they have the chance to hear this critical information.

Children are also very welcome at any events that are marked as child friendly



How do I book onto the Programme?

Please use the online booking form at www.manchester.ac.uk/international/arrival/orientation/booking-form to book your place. When you book you will be asked to tell us which core session you are coming to. Once you have made your booking you will receive an email confirming your submission and then later an e-ticket showing whether you have booked for the Friday, Saturday or Sunday presentation. Please make sure that you print this ticket off and bring it with you to Manchester. Without a ticket there is no guaranteed access to the lecture theatres. Your seat will be kept for you until 15 minutes before the start of the session (9.15 on Friday and 9.45 on Saturday and Sunday). After this time the seat will be released and your e-ticket is no longer valid.

All other events are organised on a first come, first served basis so do come along in good time to be sure of being able to participate.

Is everything free?

Everything we organise is free but the International Society do charge £6.00 for tickets to their wonderful barbecues. You can collect a ticket from the Reception desk at the International Society.

What is the Manchester Welcome?

The Manchester Welcome describes the activities, events and support that the University provides to welcome all its students. There are evening and day social events from Thursday 12 September which include such activities as campus tours, evening quizzes and films as well as 'performance' evenings of theatre, music and drama, a series of 'distinguished lectures' from academic members of staff, coach tours of the city, a film festival and street food market. The Start of Year Fair with staff from many of the University's central support services as well as external companies and GP practices will take place on Tuesday 17th and Wednesday 18th. You will be able to find out more about all the activities on the Welcome Website, from our 'What's on Guide' and from our student ambassadors when you arrive.

How should I decide what events to go to?

We would suggest that you create a plan for yourself using the pull-out planner pages in the centre of this guide. To help you make decisions about what to prioritise we have used some of our student ambassadors as examples for you;



Wanran is a new undergraduate student from China. She loves dancing and singing and English language movies. She is excited about coming to Manchester but a bit worried about being able to open a bank account and how the NHS system works. She feels confident about her spoken English but she is not sure about writing essays and what her lecturers will expect.

What events must she attend?

- ✓ International student check-in – as a non-EEA student her documentation needs to be checked and scanned (see page 24)
- ✓ Police registration appointment – Chinese nationals (along with students from other countries) must register with Greater Manchester Police. Wanran can make an appointment to do this at our Helpdesk (see page 25)
- ✓ A core presentation session – to find out critical information on studying and life in Manchester (page 6)

What events should she attend?

- ✓ The workshop run by the Students Union (page 7) to find out more about dance societies that she can join. Alternatively she might want to go and see the students on the Students' Union Helpdesk so that they can give her some of the same information. Student Ambassadors will also be playing table tennis and other games in University Place on Friday, Saturday and Sunday and she can ask them about classes.

- ✓ The Successful Start for Undergraduate Students and English Language workshops to find out more about the academic system in the UK and any help she can get with her language skills.

- ✓ The workshops on Healthcare in the UK and on Banking and Money to understand more about how to sign up with a GP (doctor) and how to open a bank account.

What events might she also make time for?

- ✓ A campus tour – always useful to be able to find your way around
- ✓ The Film Festival – a lovely, non-stressful way of relaxing with plenty of opportunities to make new friends ☺
- ✓ The performance evenings – again great entertainment, the chance to make friends and to find out more about some of the most active student societies

A guide to activities and events

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CORE PRESENTATIONS

Presentations are given by staff from across the University and the community, covering essential information relevant to all international and EEA students, regardless of your course. They are similar in style to the lectures you will have while in Manchester, and you will usually not have an opportunity to ask questions. Space in the core presentations is limited, so you must choose which day you would like to attend using the Orientation booking form (see page 2). Please ensure that you bring your booking confirmation email to your chosen presentation and arrive in good time (At least 15 minutes before the start of the presentations). The formal sessions all follow the same format, (which is outlined below) and you need only attend once. All presentations take place in University Place (Building 37 on your map).

Academic Expectations

Making your studies in Manchester a success requires a partnership between you and us. This presentation by the University of Manchester Library Teaching and Learning Staff gives you useful advice on academic matters, including: teaching and assessment methods, avoiding malpractice, and getting the most out of the University's learning facilities. It will also outline our expectations of you as a student of The University of Manchester.

Getting to Know the British

We think living in the UK is fantastic, but we also know it can be confusing when you first arrive. This presentation from the International Society will help you to understand your new home better, and show you that the British are some of the most welcoming and friendly people on the planet.

SPORT in Manchester

Playing sport and being active is a big part of student life at The University of Manchester and getting involved can really add to your University experience. Please note: Study Abroad and Exchange are terms that we use at the University to describe those students who are with us for a period of one academic year or one semester as part of a University or School wide exchange.

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WORKSHOPS

The workshop programme of Orientation aims to equip you with all of the tools and information you need as an international or EEA student to get off to a great start at The University of Manchester. The workshops are specific, practical, and interactive – similar in style to many of the tutorials you will have while studying here – and you are encouraged to ask as many questions as you like! All workshops take place in University Place (Building 37 on your map).

Careers session: Working in the UK / Making the most of your UK study experience

- Sunday 15 at 1400

Find out the essential ways that you can make the most of your UK study experience – whether you are looking to stay on in the UK or work elsewhere in the world after graduation. This session can help you to: explore part-time work or work experience during study; start thinking about your career plans and opportunities; understand what UK employers look for from international graduates; explore the steps during study that will help you to secure a graduate job offer. Please be aware that if you wish to take up volunteering opportunities with the University or elsewhere you are likely to need a Letter/ Certificate of Good Conduct from your local police force. It will be much easier if you can get this whilst you are still at home. English Language Support

- Saturday 14 at 1500
- Sunday 15 at 1300

An opportunity to find out how the University can help you improve your English and academic skills during your studies. This session is aimed at non-native speakers of English who would like to access support.

Getting involved in your Students' Union

- Sunday 15 at 1400

Found the Students' Union presentation interesting and want to know more? This workshop with current elected student representatives will explain how you can get involved in: the hundreds of activities and societies, student activism, and how to get yourself elected as a student rep.

Healthcare in the UK

- Saturday 14 at 1400
- Sunday 15 at 1000

This session, led by a qualified health care practitioner from The University's Occupational Health Service, will explain how the British National Health Service works, how to register with a General Practitioner (GP), where to buy medicines and how to call for emergency assistance. Immigration Advice

- Sunday 15 at 1400

Staff from the International Advice Team will run these workshops. These sessions will give you the chance to find out more about your obligations under Tier 4 and about how the University will go about meeting the requirements imposed on us by the UK Border Agency. You will also have the chance to ask any questions relating to your own situation.

IT on Campus

- Saturday 14 at 1400

This session will introduce you to the range of IT provision and support at the University. The speaker will discuss ways to keep your online profile secure and give some advice on using social networking sites. There will also be an opportunity to find out more about copyright, malpractice and issues arising from improper use of the web.

Living in a Diverse Community

Manchester is home to one of the most diverse communities in the UK. This session from the Equality and Diversity Team will explain the values and legal protections that make the UK such a multicultural place to live and study, as well as giving you an opportunity to reflect on your own approach to different cultures.

You've made a big decision to come to Manchester for your Masters. This session will help you make the most of your time here right from the start, covering: different teaching and learning issues at Masters level, undertaking research, and writing a dissertation.

Successful Start for Postgraduate Research Students (PGR)

- Sunday 15 at 1500

We expect a lot from our junior academics, and it's only right that you should expect a lot from us too. In this session, a current PhD researcher will give you an outline and lead a discussion on what it means to be a postgraduate researcher at The University of Manchester. They will give you useful and practical advice about the University's online tool to record and monitor progression and skills training activity of PGR students, using the library effectively and accessing their courses, PhD student study villages, having and maintaining a social life, assessment and vivas. You will also have plenty of time to ask your own questions. This session also includes a presentation on Managing a Successful Supervision Relationship. Such a successful working relationship with your PhD supervisor can be critical to success and enjoyment, in your research. This workshop will equip you with the tools to build, and maintain, successful professional relationships with your supervisor and other colleagues in your department.

Successful Start for Undergraduate Students

- Sunday 15 at 1400

We know that starting an undergraduate degree can be quite a daunting prospect; don't worry, it's perfectly normal to feel a little anxious. This session will provide an introduction to studying at degree level and will cover different teaching and learning methods, academic writing and undertaking research. This session is for students studying on any academic programme.

Sustainability at Manchester

- Saturday 14 at 1500
- Sunday 15 at 1500

This session, led by a member of the University's sustainability team, will introduce you to the environmental issues being tackled on campus and how you can play your part.

University Support Services

- Saturday 14 at 1400
- Sunday 15 at 1200

An interactive overview of the Support Services available to all students, using real-life case studies to give you the knowledge about where you can get quality advice and guidance on a range of academic and non-academic matters.

Your Money and Banking

- Saturday 14 at 1500
- Sunday 15 at 1100

The aim of this session is to provide you with help in adjusting to a new financial system, new currency and different costs of items in shops and there will be some additional information available on how to budget your finances. Information will also be available on UK banking and how to open a bank account. Our presenter will allocate time at the end of the session to answer any questions you might have. If you would rather not raise your hand to ask a question you are welcome to ask it via Twitter. As part of the Orientation Programme we will be providing you with the opportunity to go to a supermarket. The trip to the supermarket (Asda) will be by bus and Student Ambassadors will be guiding the group on each day. Asda is one of the UK's largest and best value supermarket chains and you will be able to buy everything from food to bedding, pots, pans, stationery and clothes.

Get-On-Get-Off Bus

- Friday 13, Saturday 14 and Sunday 15
First bus leaves Brunswick Street
(100 and 101 on your map) at 1000
Last bus arrives back at Brunswick Street
at 1700

The Get-On-Get-Off Bus is a free shuttle bus service for new students running on a loop between the University campuses and Manchester city centre. The bus is designed to help you get to know Manchester and allow you to travel to the city centre quickly and easily during your first few days in the UK. The bus will stop at five different stops staffed by Student Ambassadors: Brunswick Street on the University's south campus, St. Peter's Square, Deansgate (at the John Rylands Library), Piccadilly Gardens and the Sackville Street Building on the University's north campus. There is no need to pick up a ticket for the service, but please be aware that you may have to queue during busy periods.

Faiths and National Societies Fairs

- Sunday 15 1400 – 1800 at the Students' Union
(Building 68 on your map)

Come along and meet representatives from the Union's national and faith societies and find out how you can get involved. Joining a society is a fantastic way to try out new experiences and meet people with similar interests. Societies are a great starting point to your social life in Manchester.

Parkrun

- Saturday 14 at 0845

Come along and join the sports department for a brisk 5km run, jog or stroll around one of Manchester's local parks. This is a great way to meet new people, get some fresh air and learn a little bit more about the sports and fitness activities on offer at the University. The 5km course starts from the Lakeside Centre in Platt Fields Park, Fallowfield (look out for the purple gazebo). Please meet at 8:45am for a prompt 9am start and remember to wear your trainers or running shoes. If you want to record your time then make sure you register in advance at www.parkrun.org.uk/register and bring your barcode along.

Self guided tours

There are two self guided tours which focus on the social and non-academic areas of campus and the locality. One tour takes you south along the Oxford Road corridor and towards Rusholme, the other takes you north towards the city centre. Each tour takes between 1 and 2 hours to complete. Guides can be collected from any helpdesk.

Students' Union Food Market

Come along to the Students' Union Food Market to sample some fantastic food and find out more about the University's culinary societies and collectives. Joining a society can be an excellent way of meeting other new students, so why not come along and see if there's something for you.

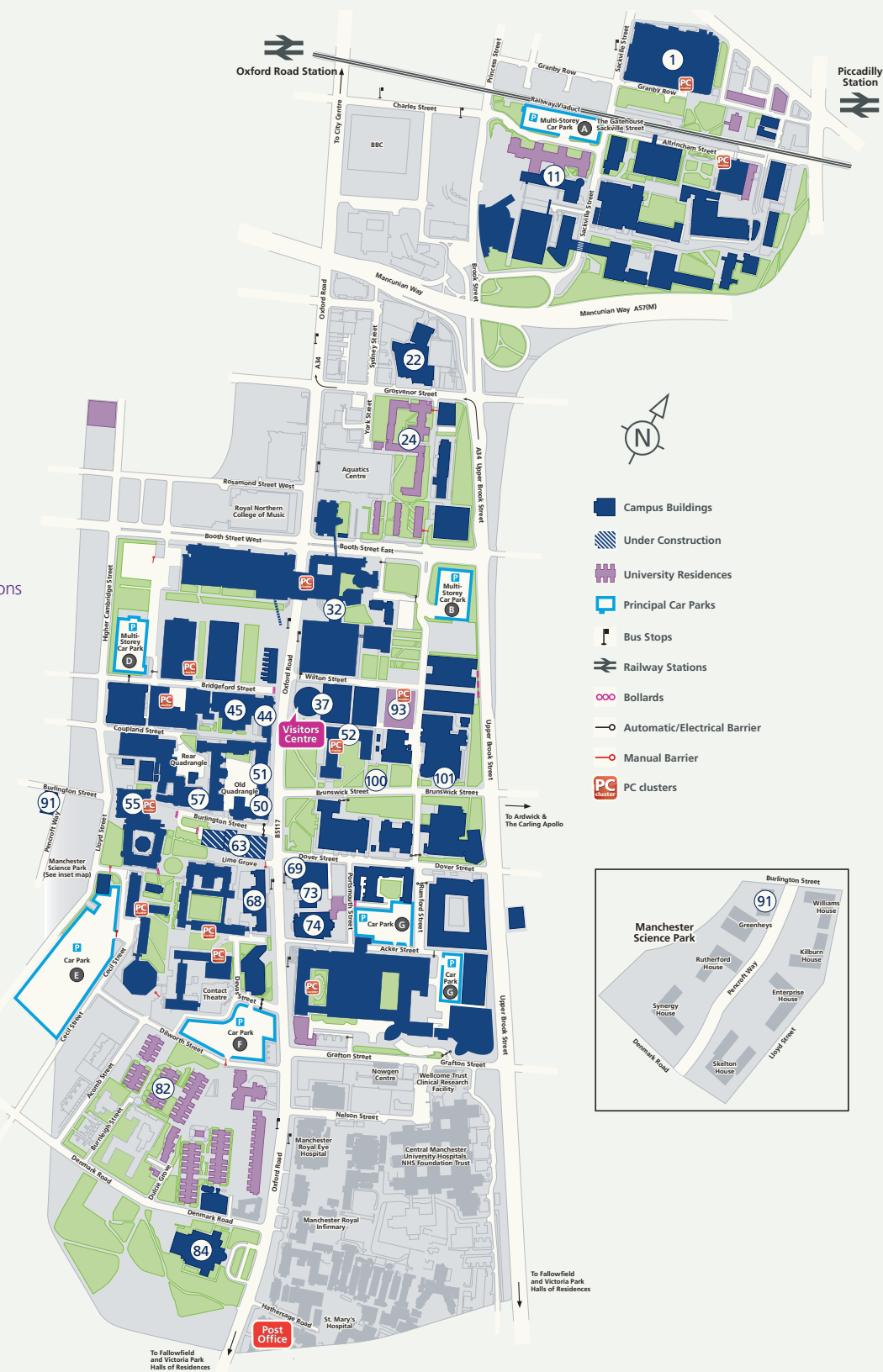

Accommodation

Please note: accommodation is not provided as part of the Orientation Programme. If you are going to be staying in University accommodation during your studies here, we will make every effort to place you in your permanent, term-time accommodation throughout the Orientation Programme. The start date for most University Accommodation contracts is Thursday 12 September, however, some contracts do not commence until Saturday 14 or Sunday 15 September.

If you are unsure of the date on which your accommodation contract starts please contact the accommodation office by emailing accommodation@manchester.ac.uk. If you intend to arrive prior to the beginning of your contract, bookings can be made online from July 2013 via: <http://estore.manchester.ac.uk/browse/product.asp?compid=1&modid=1&catid=301> and clicking the link for early arrivals.

If you are living in University accommodation, you might want to order a bedding pack to cut down on your luggage. This should be done in advance at estore.manchester.ac.uk, please type the words 'bedding pack' in the search box.

Alternative accommodation arrangements

If your term-time accommodation cannot offer you a room for the period of the Orientation Programme, please make appropriate arrangements with a hotel or hostel. A list of alternative accommodation can be found via the following link www.accommodation.manchester.ac.uk/open-house.

Access to Internet / PCs

In order to access the University's computer network you must follow a sign-up procedure which you can do before arriving in Manchester or from a University computer cluster. There will be Student Ambassadors at the International Student Check-In during the Orientation Programme and Welcome who are available to help you with any aspect of your IT use, from completing registration to connecting online. You will need to have your date of birth and University ID number which you will receive with your registration information.

IT sign up will give you a username and password which you can use on any University computer. You can then access the internet and, if you have not already done so, complete University registration.

Opening a UK Bank Account

If you are studying with us for more than one semester, you are likely to want to open a UK bank account. This can sometimes be a difficult experience for non-UK students and will certainly take some time. You should ensure that you have enough funds available to cover you for your first two weeks in Manchester in case there is a delay with opening an account. One major difficulty that students encounter is when their names are recorded differently on their passport from their student record so please do make sure that these are identical.

Please note: that when you come to open a bank account in the UK you will need the following documents -

- (1) Your passport to prove your identity.
- (2) A bank letter from the University which confirms your home address (this cannot be a PO Box) and your address in Manchester (this cannot be a hotel).
- (3) Your University accommodation contract (if you will be living in University accommodation).

If you arrive between 2 and 20 September you can collect a bank letter from the IT Helpdesk International Student Check-In.

You will also need to be aware that if you want to pay your fees from monies in a new UK bank account, it will take at least 5 days for the account to become active so you will not be able to fully enrol and receive your student ID card until this process is complete.

Early Payment Scheme

The University has introduced a mandatory deposit scheme for International applicants on postgraduate courses in the Schools of MACE, EEE, Life Sciences and Maths. Some postgraduate courses in Manchester Business School are also affected but students should check this requirement directly with MBS. A full list of affected courses are available here: my.manchester.ac.uk/d/crucial-guide/financial-life/tuition-fees/payment/tuitionfeedeports

The deposit required will be £1,000. If students choose to pay more (up to a maximum of the total tuition fees for their course for the academic year) then they can do so. Any payment made under this scheme will not be refunded unless the student is refused a visa and provides a copy of their visa refusal notice to the International Advice Team (iat@manchester.ac.uk). The deposit will not be refunded if the refusal notice cites fraud as the reason for refusal.

Students receiving full scholarships will be exempt from the requirement to pay a deposit. Proof of award should be emailed to: sponsorletters@manchester.ac.uk

Students who have paid for a pre-session English course will also be exempt from the requirement to pay a deposit for the main course.

If you do need to pay a mandatory deposit through the Early Payment Screen you will be sent an email containing a link to a webpage that will tell you how to complete the sign up for a University IT account and also instructions on how to make the payment online.

Students who are unable to pay by credit/debit card can choose to pay by alternative payment methods e.g. bank transfer, but such payments will take longer to process. Your CAS will not be generated until the payment is received by the University.

The University of Manchester has partnered with Western Union, one of the world's largest specialist provider of international payment services offering students the ability to pay their tuition fees and accommodation charges at a guaranteed exchange rate, no bank charge deductions and in your own currency. Food and Drink

No food is provided as part of the Orientation Programme but you can buy meals, snacks and drinks from various outlets across campus. Details of these can be found at www.foodoncampus.manchester.ac.uk. If you have any questions about the food available, please ask a Student Ambassador or a member of staff at the catering outlet. It is advisable to have some cash with you to purchase food and drink.

GP (Doctor) Registration

Registering with a local GP will allow you to consult a doctor if you are unwell. GPs will be available on campus to register you at the University Start of Year Fair. They will be located on the ground floor of University Place on Tuesday 17 and Wednesday 18 September. If you miss the Fair, you can check where your nearest GP is located on the NHS site www.nhs.uk/servicedirectories/Pages/serviceSearch.aspx

Helpdesks

There will be several helpdesks open during the programme where you can get advice and information. You will find helpdesks in selected University accommodation (see maps 1 and 2), the Students' Union on Oxford Road and at the Orientation venues. The helpdesks will be staffed by our student helpers – 'Student Ambassadors' – who will be available all around campus to answer any questions you may have, to give you directions and generally to make sure you have a happy, safe and informative welcome to the University. If there is anything you would like to know or if you have any problems, don't hesitate to ask a Student Ambassador.

Library

As the Orientation programme runs outside of term time you will find that the libraries are running to vacation timetables. You can check the opening hours for the Main Library Alan Gilbert Learning Commons and site libraries at www.manchester.ac.uk/library/aboutus/locationsandopeninghours

As well as the printed and electronic collections, many of the libraries have computer clusters where you can complete registration and IT sign up.

You always need your student card to access the library so if you do want to get in before then you will need to speak to the staff on duty.

Locations

You should check the information on events on pages 10 - 19 of this guide to find out where all events are located. We have also included maps on pages 20 and 27.

Photography

A photographer will be taking pictures during Orientation to use in future publicity materials for the University. If you do not wish your photo to be taken then please speak directly to the photographer and let them know.

Safety and Security

Manchester is a safe place to live, but as in all cities you need to be aware of your own safety and security. The University's Security Services have a very useful website on crime reduction www.estates.manchester.ac.uk/CrimeReduction/index.asp and will also make a presentation to you during Orientation.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in any University buildings, or indeed any public space. Even when you are outside, you will need to check whether you are in a no smoking zone as sometimes these are created outside of buildings to protect people working inside.

Students' Union

Every student is automatically a member of The University of Manchester Students' Union. The Union exists to; represent you to the University, provide you with advice, guidance, opportunities and entertainment all through your time here.

The Union are running workshops and making presentations during Orientation so you will have the chance to meet your representatives. In addition, many of our evening events are held at the Union so you will be able to see the building then.

University Accommodation Events and Activities

From Thursday 12 September each university residence will be running its own series of talks and events. These will include a Warden's "Welcome Talk" and information on safety and fire awareness. Further details will be available at your accommodation on arrival.

University Registration

You can register online from Monday 2 September 2013. Log in to my.manchester.ac.uk using your central username and password (generated during IT Sign Up) and select 'Registration' from the 'My Services' tab. You can do this from home, or from any of the University computer clusters.

Please note: you must give your name exactly as it appears on your passport when you first register otherwise you will have problems when your passport is scanned, at police registration and when trying to open a bank account.

After completing registration steps 1-9 or 1-10 if you are paying by credit card of bank transfer and if you are not from the EEA or Switzerland, you must come along to International Student Check-in to: have your

passport and documents scanned, arrange a police registration appointment (if needed), collect a Confirmation of Attendance letter and, if needed, a Bank Letter to enable you to open a bank account. **Please note: information entered into your student record takes 24 hours to upload so you must allow this length of time between online registration and coming to the Check-In venue.**

If you have already paid your tuition fees in full when you attend check-in you will be able to collect your student card at this venue.

If you still need to arrange payment of your tuition fees then you will be advised to proceed to one of the registration venues, Whitworth Hall or Main Library to complete the payment of your tuition fees and collect your student card.

Vaccinations

Meningitis C is a potentially serious disease which has a higher prevalence amongst student populations. In the UK the chief medical officer for health, advises and recommends that students up to the age of 25 years have a Meningitis C vaccination. All students are strongly advised to have the Meningitis C and 2 MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccinations before arriving in Manchester. If you have not received these vaccinations before you arrive, they are available free of charge from your GP in the UK. Make sure that you register with a GP (see above) and, if necessary, get these vaccinations at the earliest opportunity.

Immigration permission

If you are not from the EEA or Switzerland, you must check before you travel to the UK that you have Tier 4 immigration permission (visa) that allows you to study at The University of Manchester.

If you used a CAS from the University of Manchester to apply for Tier 4, the immigration permission in your passport should contain **The University of Manchester's sponsor license number: Q3DK76WN4**. If you have immigration permission with a different sponsor license number on it you will not be permitted to register with us until you have made an application to switch Tier 4 sponsors.

If you are overseas and you have immigration permission with a different sponsor license number on it and you applied with a CAS from a different Tier 4 institution you should make a new Tier 4 application from overseas. You should not travel to the UK with the intention to study at The University of Manchester if you have immigration permission with a different sponsor license number on it as this could lead to problems with immigration when you arrive in the UK.

International Student Check-In

If you are not from the EEA you must attend International Student Check-In before you pay your tuition fees (unless you've done this online) or pick up your student card.

At Check-In we will scan your passport and documentation which means that you will only have to show us your identification documents once. Once we have scanned your passport, you only need to show staff across the University this check-in card, which will make the rest of Registration much quicker.

You will also have the opportunity to get important and useful documents, such as a bank letter or an appointment with the International Visitor Registration Office (Police Registration).

International Student Check-In is open every day from 0900 – 1700 in the Whitworth Corridor of Whitworth Building (Building 50 on your map).

Police Registration

Certain nationalities are required to register with the police within 7 days of arrival in the UK. Please check the stamp in your passport/visa to see if you need to register. If you are required to register you must make an appointment to visit the International Visitors Registration Office.

In order to provide the most efficient service, registration will be managed using a combination of scheduled appointments and drop-ins.

Before 2 September and after 30 September

If you arrive before 2 September or after 30 September, you should contact the International Visitors Registration Office directly.

You must take with you:

- your passport;
- your visa;
- one passport size photograph;
- a Confirmation of Attendance letter from the University;
- £34 registration fee per person in cash;
- Confirmation of your address; and
- Sponsor letter (if you are a sponsored student).

You will be asked to fill in an application form when you get to the office. It is possible that you will have a long wait at the Office as a very large number of students have to register at this time.

Between 2 September and 20 September

During this period you can book an appointment at the Office at International Student Check-In. See map page 26.

You will be issued with a form to complete and take to the Office along with a checklist of the other documentation and payment you will need. We will also make a note of your name and your appointment time. It is important that you do attend the appointment. You cannot swap appointment times with another student. You must make the appointment within 7 days of arrival, but due to the large numbers of students arriving, the Registration Office may not be able to see you for several weeks; this will not affect your immigration status.

During this period, please do not go to the International Visitor Registration Office without an appointment as you will be turned away.

Between 21 September and 30 September

If you arrive during this period, you must go first to your academic School to let them know that you have arrived and so that they can put you in touch with the International Office in Rutherford Building. Our student helpers will book you an appointment at the Office.

You will be issued with a form to complete and take to the Office along with a checklist of the other documentation and payment you will need. We will also make a note of your name and your appointment time. It is important that you do attend the appointment. You cannot swap appointment times with another student. You must make the appointment within 7 days of arrival, but due to the large numbers of students arriving, the Registration Office may not be able to see you for several weeks; this will not affect your immigration status.

During this period, please do not go to the International Visitor Registration Office without an appointment as you will be turned away.

If you are a student on Pre-session language course, please follow the instructions given by staff in the Language Centre.

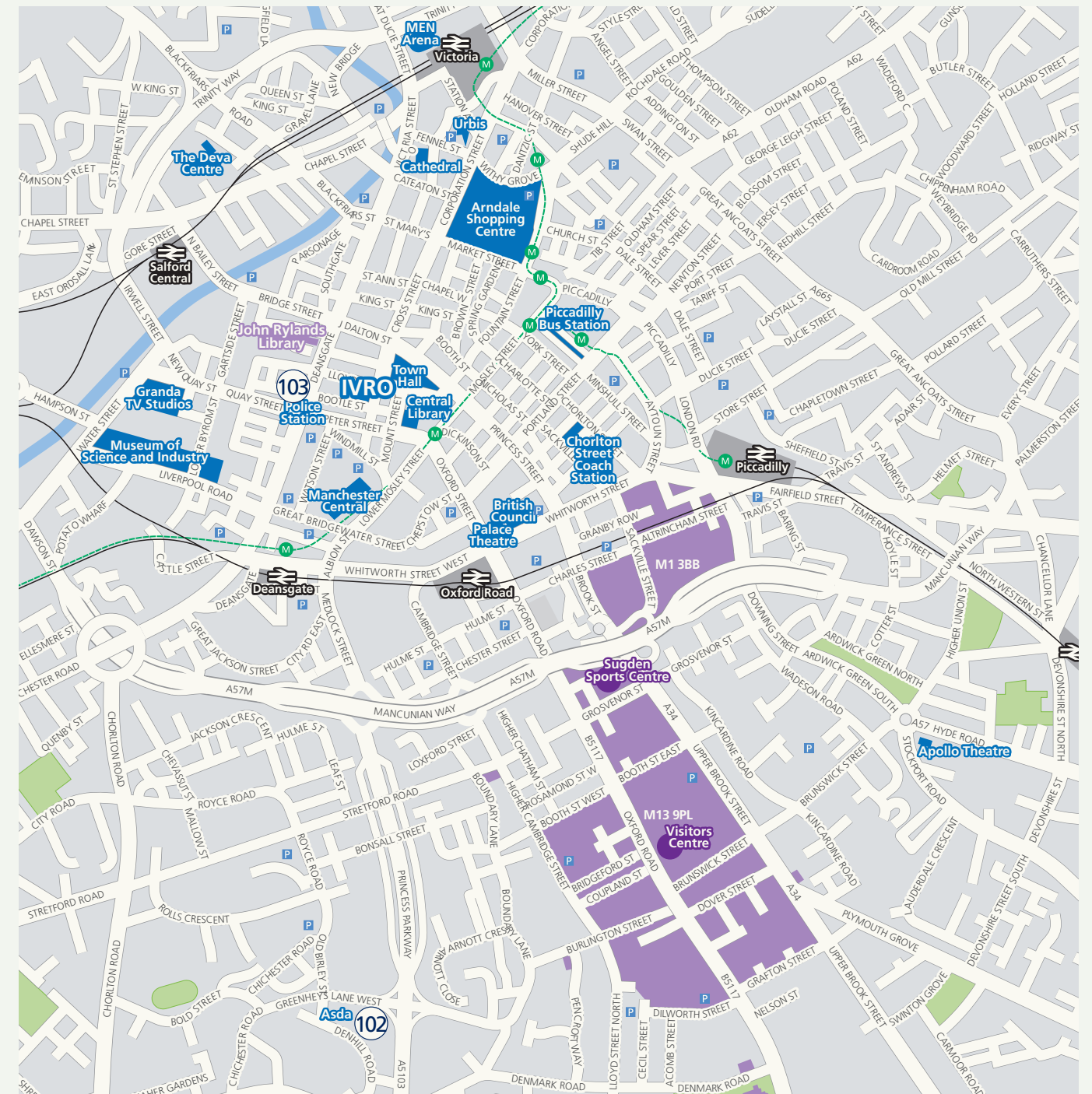
