What is higher education for?


- The purpose of higher education is to create independent critical thinkers and decision makers, not just receivers of knowledge

- Information availability means that education is far more about how to think, and how to sift through huge amounts of information rather than rote learning








Changes and challenges

network' tool


- New content editor

Lecture capture

- Over the last two years we have been experimenting with lecture capture
- Devised a system where recordings are made automatically for any T+L activity
- Academics teach normally and everything else is done for them
- From Sept, 100 locations will be capture-enabled and staff will need to opt-out if they do not want recordings made








Online assessment

- Helps both students and teachers
 - Consistent, accurate results
 - Immediate feedback
 - Increased opportunities for students to act on feedback







Online assessment

- Helps both students and teachers
 - Opportunities to combine human and computer marking
 - Creative media and online peer and self-assessment
 - Evidence on the effectiveness of curriculum design and delivery
 - Formative and summative online assessments incorporated into design and delivery of each unit



Online assessment

- The online assessment engine in Bb works!
 - In May/June 2013 over 1,000 students sat summative online exams for 15 separate units
 - No technical issues arose
 - Need to rebuild confidence in online assessment

 - Learning integrated into existing professional/personal/domestic commitments


DL and MOOCs


- Why do we do DL?

Distance Learning

- UoM delivers a wide range of UG, PG and CPD programmes through DL or blended approaches
- Over 7,000 students registered on DL programmes at UoM
- DL is a big activity both in terms of student numbers and revenue
- Joined up approach to move away from 'cottage industry'








MOOCs

- Massive Open Online Courses
 - Set to change the face of HE
 - Lots of hype (and hope)
 - UoM has signed with Coursera
 - Aim to offer 5-6 MOOCs initially which are linked to strategic goals/aims of Schools
 - Courses will run free of charge to participants
 - Showcase UoM teaching




