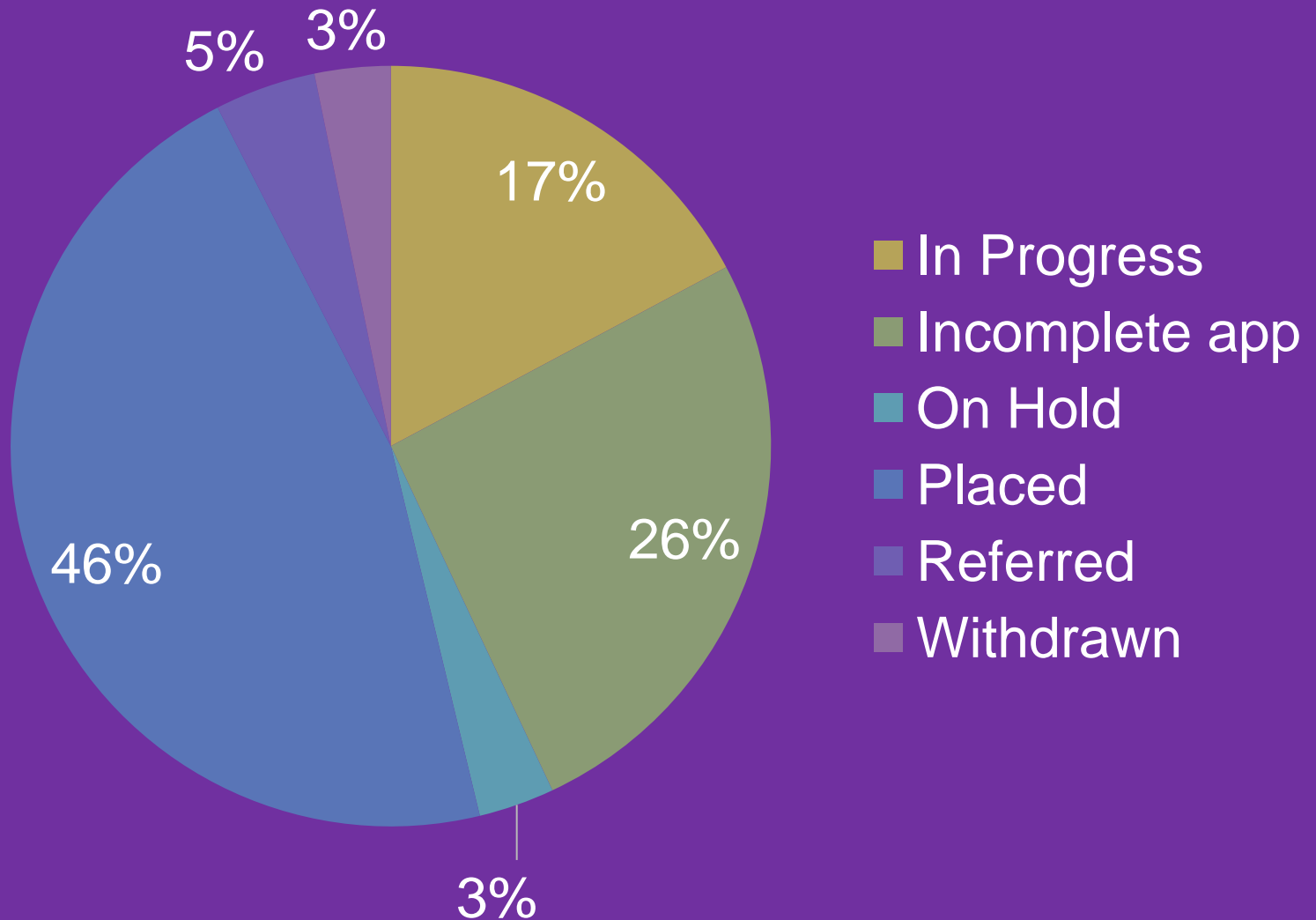

# SGOSS Data

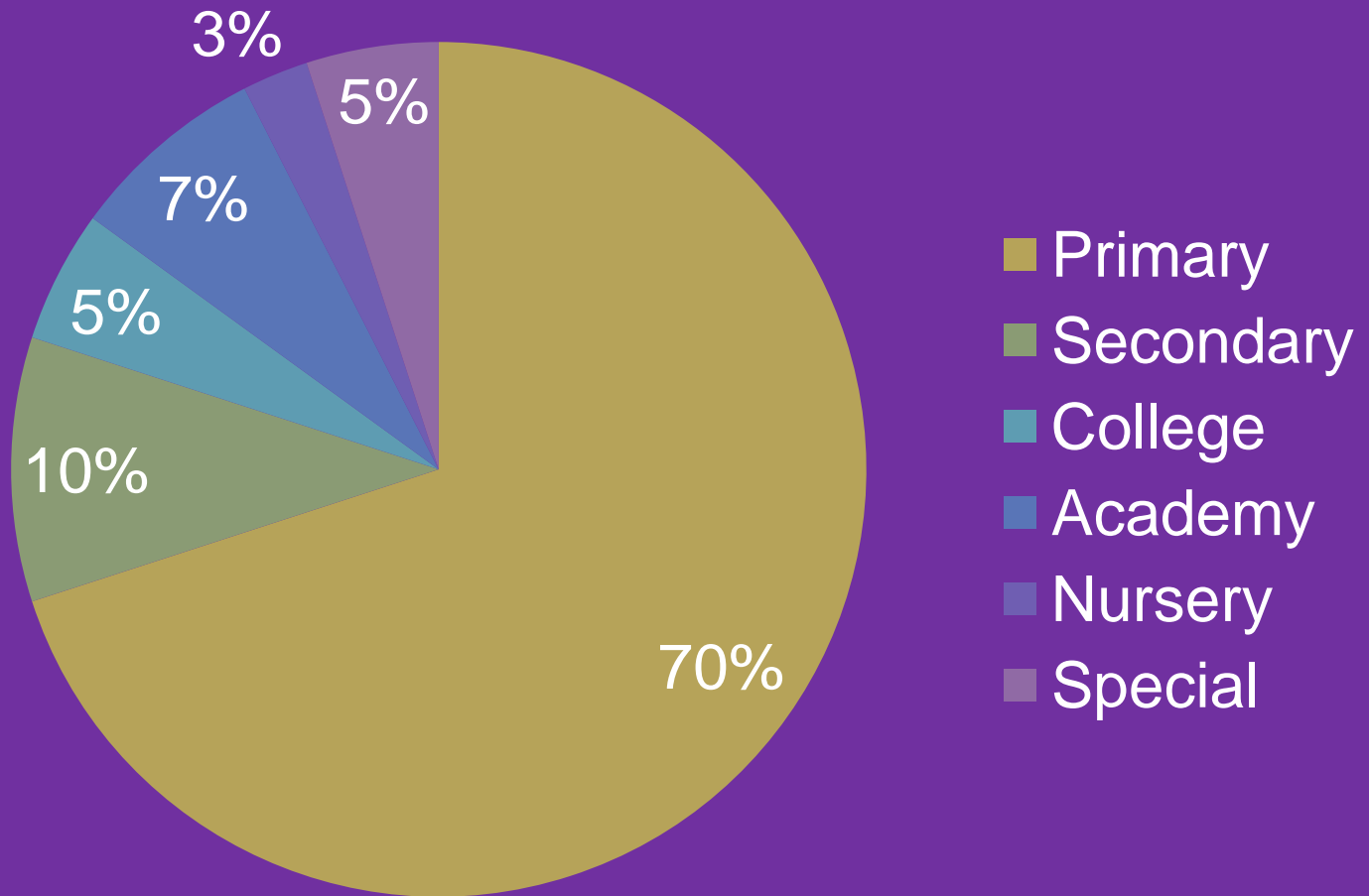
- ▣ 39 volunteers placed
