- All Level 1 History Honours students will be automatically enrolled on HIST10101 History in Practice (20 credits) (List A)
- Students studying on the single honours programme BA (Hons) History can, if they wish, study a Minor subject alongside their main subject. A full Honours degree comprises 120 credits per year, with at least 80 credits gained from the main subject area. A Minor studied alongside the Single Honours subject will account for 40 credits of your total 120 credits per year. **If you wish to study a Minor, please select 120 credits by following Steps 2, 3, 4, and 5 below (Lists B: only 20 credits, C, D, and E1). Please note that subject combinations are subject to availability and timetabling constraints**
- Alternatively, student who do not wish to choose a Minor can choose up to 40 credits of free choice from across the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures, the School of Social Sciences and the University College for Interdisciplinary Learning. **If you do not wish to choose a Minor subject, please select 120 credits by following Steps 2, 3, 4, and 6 below (Lists B, C, D, E2)**

After following Steps 1; 2; 3; 4; and 5, or 1; 2; 3; 4 and 6 below, all Level 1 History Honours students must have:

- Selected exactly 120 credits
- Selected no fewer than 50 credits of course units in each semester
- Selected no more than 70 credits of course units in each semester
- Ensured that the lectures for their course units do not clash – **check the timetable**

Note on Credit Allocation Across Semesters:

- The semester in which a course unit is taught is identified by the last digit in the course code (e.g. HIST10101 = semester 1). A 0 (zero) final digit indicates the course unit is taught across both semesters
- When calculating your credit allocation by semester, the credits for 0 (zero) coded courses should be divided equally between semester 1 and semester 2

Please note that swapping or dropping full-year optional modules is prohibited after week 2 of semester 1.

Availability of modules will depend upon the timetabling of your History in Practice seminar group. Please make sure that you check for any potential timetabling clashes before selecting your modules.

<p>Choosing a Minor: Please select the relevant course units for the Minor, ensuring that you choose <u>all 40 credits</u>. Please note that subject combinations are subject to approval, availability and timetabling constraints.</p> <p>As a single honours student on this programme you have the option to study a minor in either Egyptology or Digital Humanities. Taking a minor allows you to explore the subject area, whilst still allowing you to complete your single honours degree. At the end of the first year, you can choose to continue with the minor in years two and three, and have the subject feature in your degree title if you wish. If you chose 40 credits from List B, you may only select 20 from this list. If choosing 40 credits from E2, these cannot have the same subject code classification, i.e. you cannot choose two CAHE-coded courses. You can only choose a maximum of 20 credits of Free Choice units from outside SALC.</p> <p>Note: Academic Advising – Students thinking about taking (a) course units in any Subject Area in the Faculty of Humanities, including School of Arts, Languages and Cultures and the School of Social Sciences, (b) course units in the University College for Interdisciplinary Learning, or (c) University Language Centre course units are strongly encouraged to speak with their Academic Advisor to discuss suitable options.</p>	If no minor: 20-40 Credits
